
Dear Friends in Christ,

Although it is not observed liturgically because this year it falls on a Sunday, 25 January is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, the Church's annual celebration of the day when Saul of Tarsus met the Lord Jesus on the Damascus Road — an event that changed Saul's life and the history of the world. 25 January is also each year the final day in a Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, an observance that begins on 18 January — in the old liturgical calendar the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter. So, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity was devised to run between the twin feasts of the symbol of Peter's authority to teach and Paul's conversion to Christ, and this placement in the liturgical calendar shows us how Christian unity is to be found: through continuing conversion to the truth of the Gospel proclaimed authentically and authoritatively by the apostolic office of the Church.

In praying for Christian unity, we are asking God to restore full ecclesial communion to our separated brethren (both Orthodox and Protestant) in the one, true Church. But the restoration of that unity will be a world-historical event brought about only by the action of the Holy Spirit, and there is little that any of us can do to contribute directly to that lofty goal. There is, however, another dimension of Christian unity to which we can contribute personally, and it is both utterly simple and extremely difficult: We can each live in full communion with the Lord Jesus and his holy Church and do our best to show others how to do the same. This we do by radical conversion, deep fidelity, joyful discipleship, and courageous evangelism.

- ♣ Do I believe and profess everything the holy Catholic Church believes, teaches and proclaims to be revealed by God? Do I believe that the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are inspired by God and contain no errors in matters of faith and morals? Do I believe that the Catechism of the Catholic Church is an authentic compendium of the saving doctrine of the Lord Jesus and a faithful statement of Catholic teaching in full keeping with Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition? Do I surrender my intellect and will in the obedience of faith to the Gospel transmitted in and by the Catholic Church?
- ♣ Do I live according to the saving truth of the Gospel? Do I attend Mass every Sunday and holy day of obligation? Do I confess my sins regularly in the Sacrament of Penance? Do I bear witness to Christ by my manner of life and my behavior, both personal and professional? Am I married in the Catholic Church, or if not, do I refrain from receiving the sacraments? Do I make decisions, especially difficult decisions, according to the mind of Christ or simply according to my own wisdom? Do I live according to the Ten Commandments and Christ's Law of Love?

Believing and behaving lead to belonging. If I want to belong to Christ and his Church fully and faithfully, then I must believe the truth of God's Word and behave according to the truth of the Gospel by grace through faith. As the Church concludes this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, let us be guided by Peter's faith and Paul's conversion to be committed Catholics and true witnesses to Christ.

Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

I write to you on the occasion of Catholic Schools Week which begins today. Each year a week is set aside to recognize the countless achievements of our Catholic schools and the many benefits of sending our children to them.

In the Diocese of Charleston we are fortunate to have 33 Catholic schools spread throughout the State of South Carolina with an enrollment of nearly 7, 000 students. The many indicators of the high quality of the education provided by these schools include: the selection of Prince of Peace Catholic School in Taylors as a **2014 National Blue Ribbon School** by the U.S. Department of Education (one of only 50 in the country); the honoring of Sr. Catherine Noecker, OSF, at St. Anthony of Padua Catholic School in Greenville as **2014 Distinguished Principal** (chosen from over 5,000 Catholic elementary school principals) by the National Catholic Education Association (NCEA); the NCEA award to St. Peter's School in Columbia of the **2014 Innovations in Catholic Education Award**; the recognition of Bishop England High School in Daniel Island and St. Joseph's Catholic School in Greenville as **2014 Schools of Excellence** by The Cardinal Newman Society (an honor earned by only 5% of all Catholic schools); and the selection of St. Joseph School Advisory Board in Anderson as **2015 Outstanding Board Award** by the NCEA (one of only five in the country).

Catholic schools not only offer an education of quality, but also provide students with standards and benchmarks of good citizenship and concern for others. As an example, students at St Gregory the Great participated in a Jump Rope for Heart fundraiser and raised \$11,339 for the American Heart Association.

The newly instituted St. Thomas Aquinas Scholarship Fund provides tuition for exceptional needs students who attend Catholic schools. Under this program, you may make a qualifying donation to the fund and receive a 100% tax credit on your income taxes. We are proud that our schools have collectively assisted over 150 children with exceptional needs and provided to them \$1.75M in tuition scholarships in the last 12 months.

I urge you to consider sending your children to Catholic Schools where they can receive a well-rounded education that will be instrumental in ensuring their success in further education and life.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The family around the world today faces tremendous challenges. In Latin America, where Christian values remain important, man families are wounded by hostility from the surrounding environment and by broken relationships within the family. Yet throughout the hemisphere, the Church continues to point the way to Christ as the source of hope and healing within the family and in society. Many family and catechetical ministry projects funded by the Collection for the Church in Latin America offer families and communities a way to strengthen, affirm, and celebrate their life together in faith, offering a different and hopeful vision of relationships with one another and with God.

In Cuba, migration and economic pressures are only a few of the many internal and external circumstances that pose threats to Catholic families, as they strive to practice and share their faith. A grant requested by the Archdiocese of Havana is addressing these challenges by forming family pastoral ministers who are helping nourish families, so they can live an authentic, integrated experience of faith at home and in the wider community.

Through this project, the archdiocese placed an increased focus on family ministry, supporting ninety eight communities with existing programs. Monthly, one day meetings are held with the communities which includes workshops, interactive exercises, and best practices for family ministry. The project also promotes the Rosary and prepared people for both the National Day of Families held in May and the Annual Diocesan Gathering of Families held in June of 2014. In addition to the monthly meetings, a separate retreat as held for the facilitators of the groups that work with young couples.

Our diocese will take up this collection January 25th. Please be generous in this collection and take this opportunity to share your faith with families in Latin America and the Caribbean. Your support will truly make a difference. Thank you and God Bless you.


