from the pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

The 40 Days of Lent begin on Ash Wednesday, which falls this year on 5 March – two weeks from this Wednesday. In the service of keeping a holy Lent, it is time to make a Plan of Life which should include the three pillars of lenten discipline: fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. For example, you could resolve to ...

- + begin each day with a morning offering a short prayer of dedication for the new day
- + attend Mass every day as often as possible
- + pray the Liturgy of the Hours daily, especially Vespers at 5 pm on the Sundays of Lent
- + walk the Way of the Cross, especially at 6 pm on the Fridays of Lent
- + give more to those who have least, perhaps through the Poor Box at the church doors
- + go to Confession
- + eat less at each meal to be reminded of our need to be filled with grace
- + study Holy Scripture each day, perhaps by reading the Mass lessons
- + make the Sign of the Cross and pray before every meal, even in public
- + work to strengthen your marriage or, for those not married, renew an old friendship
- + invite someone to come with you to Mass
- + read something to deepen your knowledge of the Catholic Faith
- + close each day with an evening offering a short prayer of thanks for the day just done

One way of drawing several of these strands together would be to read one entry on each day of Lent in the new book "Roman Pilgrimage: The Station Churches" by George Weigel. This book gives an account of the ancient Roman custom of Mass in a different church on each day of Lent, and the text combines notes on the history, art and architecture of each church along with theological meditations on the Scripture readings appointed for the day. "Roman Pilgrimage" is a beautifully bound book, but the Kindle and other e-editions may be preferable in this case because all the photographs in the digital version are high resolution and in color and can be expanded for close inspection.

The Ceremonial of Bishops describes the 40 Days and the purpose of our lenten discipline in these words: "The annual observance of Lent is the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its twofold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent disposes both the catechumens (those preparing for baptism) and the faithful (those already baptized) to celebrate the paschal mystery. Catechumens are led to the sacraments of initiation ... and the faithful, listening more intently to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal promises."

As a contributing editor to *Our Sunday Visitor Newsweekly* and a blogger for Catholic Vote, she writes regularly on "all things Catholic"—from politics and catechesis to higher education and the media, with a special focus on the Church's teachings on marriage, sexuality, and femininity. Over the years her writing has also appeared in *First Things, Touchstone, Franciscan Way*, the *National Catholic Register, Faith and Family, Lay Witness, Catholic Digest,* and elsewhere. It has been honored by both the Catholic Press Association and the Associated Church Press, and was included in Loyola's *Best Catholic Writing* series.



Emily holds a BA from Miami University of Ohio (*Phi Beta Kappa, summa cum laud*), where she studied political science, history, and English literature. She also did graduate work in political theory at John Hopkins University and theology at Franciscan University.





Dominican Nugget from the Sisters

A Heart for the Poor

Part of the charism of the Dominican Sisters of Saint Cecilia is a love for the poor. Our Lord Himself preached often on the danger of setting one's heart on riches. He chose to be born in poverty and again identified Himself with the poor when He explained how each of us will be judged at the end of time: "I was hungry, and you gave me food..." (Mt. 25:35)

The Sisters identify with the poor by being poor themselves and making a vow of poverty. They also have a special love, as Christ did, for those suffering from poverty in any form: poverty of Truth, poverty of Love, poverty of health, poverty of material necessities.

Saint Dominic and Saint Cecilia both loved the poor. St. Dominic was a university student in medieval times when books were rare and written by hand on animal skins. Such texts contained all one's notes and studies. Yet Saint Dominic sold his books to feed the poor. (Today, this would be the equivalent of someone selling the car they needed to get to work.) When Dominic saw the starving poor of the city as he walked to his studies, he could not pass by without helping them in their need. "How can I study from dead skins," he said, "when living men are perishing?"

Saint Cecilia was born of a wealthy family in Rome, and lavishly gave this wealth to the hungry. Each day along the Appian Way the hungry came to be fed from her generosity. At the time of her death, one of her main concerns was that the government not confiscate her wealth, but that it be given to the poor. She begged the Lord for a miracle, so that she might live long enough to donate all she had to the pope, and the Lord granted her prayer.

Application: Do I have a heart for the poor? Am I on the lookout for ways that those around me might be in need of my love, of my time? Do I realize that all my material wealth is a gift from God, and share it with others?


