Dear Friends in Christ,

Lent begins this week with Ash Wednesday, and each one of us is called by the Lord Jesus to a deeper conversion as we prepare to celebrate the Passover of the Lord at Easter. During these 40 Days of fasting, prayer, and works of mercy, let us strive to live in fidelity to the promises of our Baptism, promises which we will renew at the Easter Vigil and at all the Masses of Easter Sunday. "Are you unaware," Paul wrote to the Christians at Rome, "that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life." (Romans 6:3-4).

To live the new life of Baptism requires that we first die to sin and self and learn to live for Christ, and the disciplines of Lent are meant to help us in the lifelong work of living by grace through faith in the Son of God. Here are some of the practical ways we can do that in these 40 Days:

+ each Sunday in Lent come celebrate Vespers at 5 pm and bring a friend.

+ give alms by making a donation to Project Host on Academy Street through the poor boxes at the doors of the church or by writing a check to Catholic Charities at 204 Douthit Street; Greenville, SC 29601.

+ go to Confession on a Wednesday afternoon from 5 to 6 pm or a Saturday afternoon from 3.30 to 4.30 pm. Go early this Lent, and do not wait until Holy Week when the lines will be long.

+ attend Mass each Monday through Friday at 7 am throughout Lent.

+ push back from every meal before you've had enough. Be mindful of your body's hunger for food and your soul's hunger for the Lord, a hunger that is satisfied only when we give ourselves without reservation in obedience of faith to the Gospel.

+ invite a lapsed Catholic to return to the practice of the Faith by joining you at Mass one Sunday in Lent. A gentle invitation is often the only thing needed to bring a soul back to the Lord Jesus.

+ each Friday of Lent at 6 pm come walk the Way of the Cross and find the strength to heed the call of the Lord Jesus to take up your cross and follow him.

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. So repent, and believe in the Gospel.

#### **LENTEN REGULATIONS 2015**

Each year the holy season of Lent provides us a special time of grace and spiritual renewal so that we may become better instruments in sharing the Gospel.

This year, Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, falls on 18 February. The present laws of the Church regarding fast and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.
- 2. Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The Obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Canon Law states:

"On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."

May this Holy Lenten Season provide us an opportunity for deepening our faith, hope and love through a life of deeper prayer, penitential practices, and works of charity.

Dear Brother and Sisters in Christ,

Soon our diocese will take up the **Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe.** The collection offers a way for Catholics in the United States to stand in solidarity with those who experience the ongoing effects of living under communism.

Grants funded by the collection support pastoral projects, scholarships, and Catholic organizations working in areas formerly under soviet control. The bishops and people of these regions still face enormous challenges in restoring church structures and in rebuilding the cultural and spiritual life of the community, tasks that are often complicated by a lack of religious freedom.

One funded group, a Czech association for women and children and the protection of unborn life, has worked for 23 years to reduce the rate of abortions in the Czeck Republic. When the association opened its doors in 1990 after the Velvet Revolution, half of all pregnancies in the country ended in abortion. Through innovative counseling and support programs at six regional centers for women in difficult situations, the association has played a major role in reducing the abortion rate from 50 percent down to 20 percent. The centers work to protect the human dignity of both mothers and children, advocating for the right to life of the unborn.

Recently, the association experienced a crisis when the Czech government withdrew operational support for its programs. The Subcommittee on the Church in Central and Eastern Europe provided a critical bridge grant that allowed the association to continue its operations while searching for a permanent funding solution. In 2014, the Czech Bishops' Conference announced that it would fund the association's operating expenses from its own budget, thereby guaranteeing the future of the association and its crucial work.

In order for projects like this one to continue, the collection needs your help. Please be generous. Your donation will continue to restore and build the future of the Church in Central and Eastern Europe. Thank you and God bless you.
