Dear Friends in Christ,

As He was ascending to the glory of the Father, Jesus said, "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Mt 28:20). And He also taught us: "Amen, amen, I say to you: unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you" (John 6:53). He fulfills both of these promises by remaining with His Church and giving Himself to us in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.

"The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend. In the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of Our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained....It is by the conversion of the bread and wine into Christ's body and blood that Christ becomes present in this sacrament....The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of bread does not divide Christ." (cf. CCC 1374, 1375, 1377)

"The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring: 'Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly His body that He was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, that this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of His blood. This change the holy Catholic Church fittingly and properly calls transubstantiation.'" (CCC no. 1376)

In the Most Blessed Sacrament we behold the same Christ now worshiped in glory by the angels and saints: Come, let us adore Him!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As many of you are aware, registered South Carolina voters passed a referendum by an overwhelming majority in November 2014 that authorizes non-profit organizations to host raffles, or games of chance. The referendum was then ratified by the South Carolina General Assembly and sent to Gov. Nikki Haley for her signature. This new non-profit raffle law became effective on April 4, 2015. The Diocese of Charleston has been actively reviewing the implications of this new law for over six months. It has been determined that maintaining proper compliance with the very stringent reporting requirements for all parishes and schools in our diocese will be too difficult to perform.

On May 26, the Presbyteral Council recommended by a unanimous vote that the diocese continue the long-standing ban on games of chance, including raffles and bingo. This is a policy that was instituted by the late Bishop David B. Thompson and continued by each successor. I have decided to accept the recommendation of the Presbyteral Council. This ban on games of chance does not apply to other organizations that are separately incorporated non-profits (i.e., Knights of Columbus, Boy Scouts of America, etc.) but will apply to all parish and school sponsored ministries. While these separately incorporated non-profit organizations are permitted to host games of chance, they are not permitted to do so on parish, school, or diocesan owned property.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC) supports projects throughout the world that evangelize both Catholics and non-Catholics alike through the use of media outlets. With the growth of new media, people all over the globe have greater opportunities to connect in the digital environment. The CCC enters this digital environment by providing grants to support local and international communications projects that share the experience of faith, worship, and witness.

With the election of Pope Francis, media interest in the Catholic Church has increased dramatically. Funding from the CCC has allowed greater coverage of the Vatican, both by Catholic media and the USCCB communications team. For example, the promotion efforts surrounding the publication of Pope Francis’s Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium* led to its listing on Amazon’s best-seller list, an unprecedented feat for an official church document. After its publication, hundreds of thousands of people connected on the USCCB Facebook page to share their faith and be inspired by quotes and discussions.

In Kenya, the CCC is developing a long-term plan to assist the Kenyan Conference of Catholic Bishops in deploying a radio network across the country. The stations and equipment will allow the Church to broadcast religious programming. The plan also includes creating space for interviews and discussions with government officials, business leaders, and community organizers. The bishops hope to foster strong ethical business plans and moral leadership that will allow the people of Kenya to realize their full potential and human dignity.

The CCC allows us to share our experience of faith, worship, and witness with the world. Please support this important work in the upcoming collection, which will be June 7, 2015, in our diocese. Remember, half of the proceeds from this Collection stay here in our diocese to support our local communication efforts such as video productions, the diocesan website and The Catholic Miscellany.



Safe Environment Concern

Why do I have to accompany my child to the restroom during Mass? Most children should be able to sit through the entire Mass without having to use the restroom. A short stop to the restroom before Mass starts should ensure your child's comfort throughout Mass. For those rare occasions during Mass that your child may need to use the restroom, parents are asked to accompany their child to the restroom to ensure the safety and well-being of the child. Our parish and the Diocese of Charleston are committed to the safety of all children. Restrooms are located in Sacred Heart Hall and can be accessed by anyone from the street. You would not allow your child to enter a restroom at a mall or a sports venue alone. As much as we would like to believe that no one would come on church property to harm a child, the church is open to the public.

Also should your child become ill, you will be at hand to tend to his/her immediate needs.

Prayer Chain Ministry

St. Mary's Prayer Chain is a network of parishioners who receive prayer requests by telephone and then pray for those requests. Please call the office at 864.271.8422, ext. 127 to submit your requests. Information received will be kept confidential.

Baptism Class

Prior to having a child baptized at St. Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to birth of child.

- Read & sign the Diocesan Code of Conduct; and
- Read & sign the Diocesan Abuse Policy.
