Dear Friends in Christ,

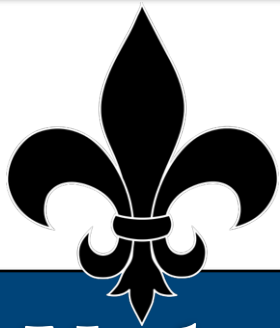
On Saturday 10 October 2015, Dr. Clark Brittain will be ordained deacon here at St. Mary's. Clark is a member of the Community of St. Anselm's and is being ordained for service in the Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter, the jurisdiction for Anglicans who have been received into full communion with the Catholic Church. Dr. Brittain did his undergraduate work at Furman University, holds three Master's Degrees, and earned his doctorate at the University of Virginia. Please join us at 11 am on Saturday 10 October for the diaconal ordination of Clark Brittain, and look for Deacon Brittain to assist in the sacred liturgy and be involved in the life of St. Anselm's and St. Mary's in a variety of ways.

Our three other candidates for the diaconate are nearly at the end of their long years of preparation. Nestor Acosta, Joe Sanfilippo, and Tom Whalen are part of a very large class of men from all over the diocese, and because of the number of candidates, their class will have two ordinations. On Saturday 30 January 2016, the first group of men will be ordained to the diaconate at Holy Spirit, Johns Island, and on Saturday 6 February 2016, the second group will be ordained at St. Mary Magdalene, Simpsonville. All of these men (and some of their wives!) have dedicated an extraordinary amount of time to prepare for this ministry in the Church, and we will be blessed to have the service of our new deacons just before Lent begins next February.

The institution of the diaconate is described in Chapter 6 of the Acts of the Apostles, when seven chosen men received from the Apostles the laying on of hands and the invocation of the Holy Spirit for service in the Church. Chapter 6 and Chapter 7 of Acts go on to tell of the extraordinary service of Deacon Stephen, who is murdered at the feet of Saul of Tarsus, thus becoming the first martyr of the Church after the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The diaconate is the first of the three degrees of the Sacrament of Holy Orders: diaconate or the Order of Deacons, presbyterate or the Order of Priests, and episcopate or the Order of Bishops. All men who are ordained to the presbyterate are first ordained to the diaconate, but some men are ordained to the diaconate without any intention of later becoming priests. These men are called permanent deacons to distinguish them from transitional deacons who are preparing for priestly ministry. But whether ordained to the transitional or permanent diaconate, all deacons are clerics who are ordained to the ministry of Word, sacrament and charity and who receive an appointment from the bishop to serve in the Church. Please pray for these four men in our community who will soon receive the imposition of hands and prayer of consecration from a successor of the Apostles to spend the rest of their lives in the service of the Lord Jesus.

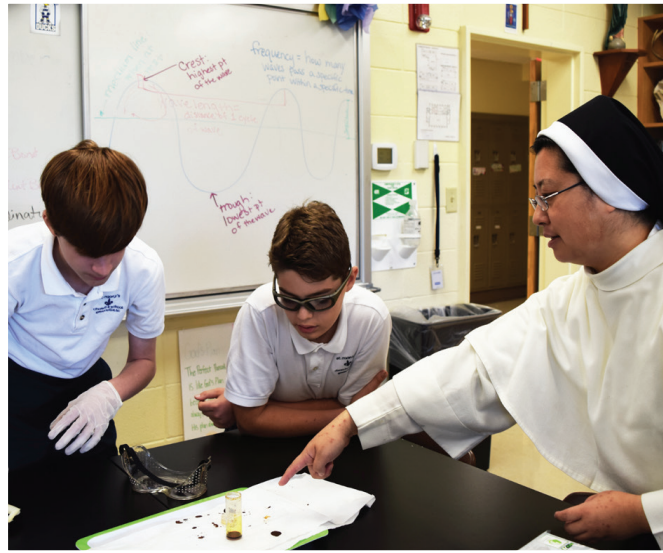

What is 40 Days for Life?

40 Days for Life, an ecumenical prayer campaign to end abortion, began in College Station, Texas. It has expanded not only nationally, but internationally since its inception in 2007. There are two campaigns a year, one beginning on Ash Wednesday for 40 days of Lent. The Fall campaign begins on the fourth Wednesday of September. These prayer campaigns are initiated and organized at the grassroots level in communities throughout the nation and abroad. Prayer, fasting and public vigil at the abortion facility are key components. The National Organization requires anyone participating in a campaign sign a promise to conduct themselves in a peaceful, respectful manner. Many believe the Holy Spirit is using this movement to end abortion and at the same time bring people of many faiths together.

Pilgrimage of Mercy Tour of the Major Relics of St. Maria Goretti

From September to November of this year the major relics of St. Maria Goretti will make a pilgrimage to the United States. Named the "Pilgrimage of Mercy," it is the first time that her body travels to the USA.

While St. Maria is universally known as the Patroness of Purity, her greatest virtue was her unyielding forgiveness of her attacker even in the midst of horrendous physical suffering, a forgiveness that would completely convert him and set him on a path to personal holiness. In March 2015, His Holiness, Pope Francis, announced an Extraordinary

Holy Year of Mercy beginning 8 December 2015. This visit of the major relics of St. Maria Goretti is an effort on the part of the Holy See and Treasures of the Church to prepare and catechize the United States for this great celebration in the life of the Church.

School Spotlight - Confession & Adoration

Beginning with the second grade, Father Newman schedules special Confession hours with each class so that students can participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation or can receive a special blessing. This year, as the students prepare for and reflect after Confession, they will have the opportunity to experience Eucharistic Adoration.

During this beautiful devotion, the Eucharistic/Communion host is displayed in a monstrance on the altar where the people can see it. We believe that the Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul & divinity of Jesus. Having the host displayed on the altar is like sitting face-to-face with Jesus.

In Confession, we turn toward God and ask Him to heal our sins so that we can have a better relationship with Him. Having Confession during Eucharistic Adoration helps bring home the reality that the Sacraments are all connected, and they are all about furthering our relationship with Jesus.



Family Prayer Corner

Prayer is essential in a person's relationship with God. Therefore, teaching your children to pray is crucial to the development of that relationship in their lives. If you pray regularly, you may find it easier to teach your children to pray. But if you were never taught how to pray or if it is something you struggle to know how to do, the task of teaching your children about prayer may seem daunting. It is natural for all of us to feel inadequate before such a task, since no one can claim to be an expert in prayer! Nevertheless, you do want what is good for your child - ultimately, the happiness of communion with God. So it is important to seek communion with God yourself before you can lead your child to that communion. It is never too late to learn to pray.

Simply put, prayer is conversation with God. St. Theresa of Avila described prayer as a sharing between friends. That makes it sound so easy, at least once we get over the fact that this Friend is invisible and inaudible. The point is, we have to enter into this conversation with the assurance that God wants to listen to us, he wants to spend time with us, indeed, he is always waiting for us to set aside the distractions of the day in order to be with him who loves us. Some people have a habit of talking to themselves or enjoy publishing their thoughts on a blog - why not try addressing those words and thoughts to God? At first, this takes some effort; we have to consciously turn toward him and remember we are speaking to Someone. In time, though, prayer will come naturally - as naturally as breathing...and as necessary.

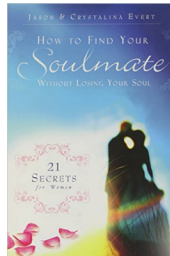
