Dear Friends in Christ,

Lent begins this week with Ash Wednesday, and each one of us is called by the Lord Jesus to a deeper conversion as we prepare to celebrate the Passover of the Lord at Easter. During these 40 Days of fasting, prayer, and works of mercy, let us strive to live in fidelity to the promises of our Baptism, promises which we will renew at Easter. "Are you unaware," Paul wrote to the Christians at Rome, "that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life." (Romans 6.3-4).

To live the new life of Baptism requires that we first die to sin and self and learn to live for Christ, and the disciplines of Lent are meant to help us in the lifelong work of living by grace through faith in the Son of God. Here are some of the practical ways we can do that in these 40 Days:

+ come to Vespers at 5 pm each Sunday of Lent, and learn to pray the Liturgy of the Hours.

+ give alms by making a donation to the poor boxes at the doors of the church or by writing a check to Catholic Charities at 204 Douthit Street; Greenville, SC 29601.

+ go to Confession on a Wednesday afternoon from 5 to 6 pm or a Saturday afternoon from 3.30 to 4.30 pm. Go early this Lent, and do not wait until Holy Week when the lines will be long.

+ attend Mass each Monday through Friday at 7 am throughout Lent.

+ push back from every meal before you've had enough. Being mindful of the body's hunger for food helps us understand the soul's hunger for the LORD, a hunger that is satisfied only when we give ourselves in the obedience of faith to the Gospel.

+ invite a lapsed Catholic to join you at Mass or Vespers one Sunday in Lent. A gentle invitation is often the only thing needed to bring a someone back to the Lord Jesus.

+ walk the Way of the Cross each Friday of Lent at 6 pm and find the strength to heed the call of the Lord Jesus to take up your cross and follow him.

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. So repent, and believe in the Gospel.

LENTEN REGULATIONS 2016

Each year the holy season of Lent provides us a special time of grace and spiritual renewal so that we may become better instruments in sharing the Gospel.

This year, Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, falls on 10 February. The present laws of the Church regarding fast and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.
- 2. Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The Obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Canon Law states:

"On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."

May this Holy Lenten Season provide us an opportunity for deepening our faith, hope and love through a life of deeper prayer, penitential practices, and works of charity.

From Our Tradition ~ Ember Days



Four times a year, the Church traditionally set aside three days to focus on God through His marvelous creation. These quarterly periods take place around the beginnings of the four natural seasons. "The purpose of their introduction, besides the general

one intended by all prayer and fasting, was to thank God for the gifts of nature, to teach men to make use of them in moderation, and to assist the needy."(Catholic Encyclopedia)

The fasts, known as "*Jejunia quatuor temporum*," or "the fast of the four seasons," are rooted in Old Testament practices of fasting four times a year:

Zechariah 8.19: "Thus says the Lord of hosts: The fast of the fourth month, and the fast of the fifth, and the fast of the seventh, and the fast of the tenth shall be to the house of Judah seasons of joy and gladness, and cheerful feasts; therefore love truth and peace." (*RSV-CE*)

These four times, each kept on a successive Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday, are known as "Ember Days," or *Quatuor Tempora*, in Latin and occur as follows:

- Winter: Advent Embertide after Gaudete Sunday (3rd Sunday of Advent). Also marked by feast of St. Lucy (13 December).
- Spring: Lenten Embertide after Quadragesima Sunday (1st Sunday of Lent)

Summer: Whit Embertide after Pentecost Sunday

Autumn: Michaelmas Embertide after the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross (14 September)


The significance of the days of the week are that Wednesday was the day Christ was betrayed, Friday was the day He was crucified, and Saturday was the day He was entombed.

Observing the Ember Days is now a voluntary practice of fasting (no food between meals) and half-abstinence, meaning that meat is allowed at one meal per day. (If you observe the traditional Friday abstinence from meat, then you would observe complete abstinence on an Ember Friday.).

Priestly ordinations, prayer for priests, almsgiving and other charitable and penitential acts and prayer for the souls in Purgatory are all customary practices on Ember Days.



Family Prayer Corner Life Lessons: Praying for Others

Our Lord taught us that when we pray, we should go to our inner room, close the door, and pray to our Father in secret (cf. Matthew 6.6). But this was not to deter us from praying with others, for he also said, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18.20). How do these two expressions of prayer fit together?

True prayer is something deeply personal, an intimate conversation with God who sees into the secret places of our hearts. That "inner room" of which Jesus spoke is where we are alone with God - "with him who we know loves us" as St. Teresa of Avila wrote. But we never enter that room empty-handed; we carry with us both friend and foe - those we desire God to bless and those we need His help to forgive. As we look upon these people in God's presence, He enables us to see them as He sees them, to love them as He loves them. In this way, our personal prayer transforms and purifies our relationships with others, strengthening our communion in Christ.

Young children must first develop a habit of speaking to God out loud before they realize that He hears even their unspoken prayers. By taking time each day to pray with your child(ren), you teach them how to speak to God and also how to bring others to Him in prayer. This can be as simple as naming loved ones and asking God to bless them.
