Dear Friends in Christ,

Numinous. This is not a word one hears in casual conversation, but it is an English word that entered our language in the 17th century from the Latin word *numen* which means divine presence. Numinous is an adjective that includes a field of meanings, including concepts like spiritual, holy, religious, transcendent, mysterious, divine, sacred, other worldly. Numinous is a good word to describe any religious experience which lifts one out of oneself and makes one aware that the visible world points beyond itself to the source of all being. The idea of the numinous is not a uniquely Christian concept, and people of all religions and no religion have experiences that can be described as numinous.

Nevertheless, Christians can profit from understanding that our worship and prayer should be characterized by a numinous quality, and this is one of the many reasons why our churches should not look like auditoriums or theaters. If the building has a numinous quality, then the liturgy which is celebrated inside that building stands a greater chance of having a numinous quality than prayer which takes place in a utilitarian structure. No one would mistake a Gothic cathedral or a Romanesque basilica for a lecture hall or a meeting room, but too many of our churches built in the last generation have just that secular quality and such spaces make a numinous experience of prayer much more difficult to attain.

But if truly sacred buildings are essential to a numinous experience of prayer, the same can be said for the style of music, the design of furnishings, vestments and vessels, the quality of ritual form, and the congregational participation which together constitute the warp and woof of public prayer. People who are present in the congregation but who refuse to worship can impede a numinous experience of prayer as much as an irreverent priest or inappropriate music, and therefore learning how to worship is an essential task for every Christian.

Learning how to worship? Doesn't that come naturally to anyone in church? No, not in the least, and just because someone is in church does not mean he is worshiping. We must be taught how to pray. And more than that, we must be shown how to worship in spirit and truth. No one can worship if anger, resentment, and pride make it impossible for him to kneel in supplication for mercy and restoration. No one can worship who will not lift up his heart in sorrow for sin, adoration of God, and praise for the divine glory revealed in the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. But once we learn to worship, then the experience of praying can be, well, numinous. A heart full of love yields both the peace of sacred silence and joy of sacred song. A heart full of love responds to the invitation to pray and seeks the Face of God in the numinous experience of a holy people gathered in a holy place to do a holy thing simply for the sake of praising the One who is holy. Praised by Jesus Christ. Now and forever!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Now is a time of great transition for our Catholic brothers and sisters serving in the United States Armed Forces. While many arc home with their families in the wake of troop withdrawals from the Middle East, others remain on the front lines to face a scattered but determined enemy. Those still deployed endure ongoing adversity, sacrifice and danger. Those back home confront major life adjustments- always aware they could be called back to action at any time, as are others who have yet to experience combat. Facing so many kinds of hardship, these Catholics in uniform rely on the priests who serve as military chaplains for spiritual support, guidance in faith and access to the sacraments.

How can we, as witnesses to the Gospel, be there for our fellow Catholics who put so much on the line to defend our County?

In 2013, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops approved a new national collection to be taken up once every three years to support the Archdiocese for the Military Services- the only arm of the Church responsible for priests who serve as chaplains in the U.S. Military around the world.

This collection offers each of us a substantial way to "serve those who serve." Funds will help the Archdiocese for the Military Services and its endorsed priests bring the Church's full range of pastoral services to the men and women in uniform, as well as their families and patients in the nation's Veteran Affairs medical centers. They will support religious education in remote locations, priestly formation of new chaplains at a time of critical shortage, and financial planning to meet the challenges of shepherding a global archdiocese that is present wherever U.S. military personnel are stationed.

The Archdiocese for the Military Services receives no government funding. Please be generous with your gift that helps assure a priestly presence for our men and women in uniform.

Have you ever wondered what exactly your Protestant neighbor believes and how best to explain Catholicism to them? 31 October 2017 is the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, and we are using this opportunity to go through the history of Protestantism in order to better understand what exactly they believe. Over 12 weeks we will be going through the history and belief of all the major Protestant denominations so you can know how to explain the Catholic faith to each specific denomination. How to Read the Bible

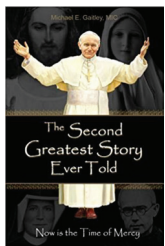

AUDITIONS for the St. Mary's Youth Choir

AUDITIONS for placement as a chorister in the St. Mary's Youth Choir will be held on Friday 25 August at 4.45 pm in the 2nd floor choir room in Sacred Heart Hall.

The auditions are open to young people 3rd - 12th grade. The process is painless and very friendly, and should last but a few minutes.



There will be a few older choristers to assist and encourage singers through the audition. No special materials are required. Singers will be asked to sing some scales in order to ascertain range and quality

of voice. They will be asked to match random pitches one at a time. Lastly, they will sing part of a piece of music to see how well they read the notes or follow the stronger singers.

This is an important year-long commitment. The choristers rehearse every Friday afternoon 3.30-5.00 pm, and on Sundays they warm up at 8.15 am in preparation for the 9.00 am Mass. All rehearsals are held in the choir room.

In addition to singing every Sunday of the year, the choristers sing on Christmas Eve and for occasional special times such as a Saturday Vigil Mass or as part of a choral concert. Exceptions to attendance at these Masses are family vacations/events and illness. Otherwise, singers are expected to be on time and to contribute positively to the group.

The commitment to sing is as important a commitment young people can make in their young lives, much like one they make in order to play on an athletic team. Rehearsals are vital, not only to the choir as a whole but important to their development as a musician. These young people not only sing, they learn HOW to sing properly. Based on the Royal School of Church Music (RSCM-Great Britain), they learn the fundamentals of reading music as well as other important aspects of self-control, discipline, and teamwork.

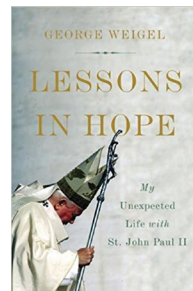
