Dear Friends in Christ,

Next weekend at all Masses we will take up a second collection to assist those afflicted by Hurricane Harvey. Please be generous so that the Church can assist those in need, especially those who had very little even before the devastation of this storm.

This Wednesday, 6 September, is the beginning of all evening classes of Christian formation: religious education for children, the Introduction to Catholicism for those who want to learn more about Catholic Christianity, and the Program of Catholic Studies course on "How to Read the Bible."

Please note that everyone who volunteers in parish activities that involve children must receive training to help insure a safe environment for the young people entrusted to our care, and earlier this year the Diocese of Charleston moved from the program called Virtus to a new program called Safe Haven, the training for which can be taken online. All staff and volunteers must complete the new Safe Haven training even if they had previously taken the Virtus course, and if you have not yet done so, it is essential that you do it in the next few days. 






What is Catholicism?




