Dear Friends in Christ,

During Eastertide the Church directs our attention to the central place of Holy Baptism in Christian faith and life, and each year on Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord, all the baptized are asked to renew the promises of their Baptism. So this is the perfect time for us to consider a crucial question in the Church's life: who is eligible to be baptized?

Before answering that question, we must take notice of the fact that for many centuries, the vast majority of people who have been baptized were brought to the font as infants, but this statistical fact should not distract us from the theological truth that the meaning of the Baptism of children is fully revealed only in light of the Baptism of adults who come to saving faith in the Lord Jesus and then ask to be baptized. All seven of the sacred mysteries of the New Covenant are sacraments of faith, and the request of an adult to be baptized presupposes the gift of faith received as a prevenient grace leading to the second birth by water and the Holy Spirit through which one enters the Church as by a door. And no one would ask for Baptism who was not prepared to live the Christian faith by, at a bare minimum, coming to Mass each Sunday to be nourished by the Word of God and the Most Holy Eucharist. In fact, in a certain sense we can say that we are baptized precisely so that we may attend Mass and receive the Body and Blood of the Savior, so those who do not intend to make Sunday Mass the center of their lives have no reason to ask for Baptism. But now we return to the statistical norm of infant Baptism and are immediately confronted with the strange custom of people who were baptized as children, have grown up to have their own children, and now ask to have their children baptized despite the fact that they seldom, if ever, come to Mass. And the same holds true for adults who are not coming to Mass but still ask for permission to serve as godparents or sponsors for the Baptism of a child.

So, who can be baptized? Those adults are eligible for Baptism who are prepared to make their own profession of faith and accept the most serious duty to practice the Catholic faith in every way, including attending Mass each Sunday and holy day of obligation. And those children are eligible for Baptism whose parents meet the same criteria as adults asking for Baptism. If the parents of a child are not practicing the faith by - at a bare minimum - attending Sunday Mass, then there is no founded hope that the child will be instructed in the Gospel and taught to follow the Lord Jesus in the Way of the Cross, and in that case, the Church cannot consent to baptize the child in question. This is not intended in any way as a punishment for the child or still less for the anguished grandparents who are practicing the faith and want their now grown children to do the same for the sake of the grandchildren, but it is an acknowledgment that the sacraments are not magic. For Holy Baptism to be a true sacrament of faith, there must be in those who request it - whether for themselves or for their children - a genuine intention to follow the Lord Jesus in every way, beginning and ending with the Sunday celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During the Second Vatican Council, a call to restore the “permanent diaconate” emanated from bishops in Latin America and Africa who suffered clergy shortages and required native vocations to tend to the needs of their growing flocks. God has a sense of humor. The diaconate became reconstituted with the first ordination class in Chicago in 1978. The United States soon occupied the vanguard of the revived Order of Deacon. The American Church has retained that position ever since as 80% of the deacons throughout the world minister in the United States.

The first seven deacons in the ancient Church of Jerusalem (among them St. Stephen) enabled the Apostles to preach the Word abroad. The Church bestowed upon them a title that meant, “to wait on table.” They devoted themselves to serve the needs of the poor, widows and orphans, the hungry and oppressed. Prior to his martyrdom, a deacon in Rome, St. Lawrence, described the poor as “the treasure of the Church.”

Deacons serve as ministers of Word, Worship and Service. Perhaps a deacon preaches in regular rotation in your parish? Perhaps a deacon baptized your child or grandchild, witnessed a family wedding or presided at a friend’s or relative’s vigil service? Perhaps he rolled up his sleeves and worked in your outreach program or served needy families and seniors at Thanksgiving or Christmas? These deacons and their spouses, who also minister and sacrifice along with their families while their loved one is away, are “some pieces of bread.”

You are always so generous. I seldom need to ask. I often just say “thank you.” I would be honored if you will assist me to enable many of our long-serving deacons and their generous wives to share in a special event over five days in mid-July, sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: Christ the Servant: Yesterday, Today, Forever. The title derives from the Letter to the Hebrews, which reminds us that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever. But He relies upon others to be his hands on earth, to go about doing good. This gathering is to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Restoration of the Diaconate in the Church.

At the request of my Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate, I authorized a one-time second collection to take place on the weekend of April 14-15 to offer scholarship assistance to our deacons and their wives to help underwrite their attendance. A portion of the overall expense will be covered by the deacon’s annual educational allotment. We aim to be good stewards. I promise a return on your investment. I know that our deacons who attend this national convocation in New Orleans will derive a benefit for their lifetimes. It won’t be a vacation in “the Big Easy.” Each day is packed with prayer and workshops and keynote speakers. The presenters are “top drawer”: speakers with national and international reputations. I am confident that the personal enrichment our deacons and their wives will derive from this gathering will filter down and renew every one of our parishes and institutions where they serve.

I am proud of our deacons. I rely on your support for them, both in and out of season. Please be as generous as your means allow, both by your material gifts in the one-time, special collection and by your prayers and affirmation for your deacons, priests, and me, your bishop, that we may continue to act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with our God.

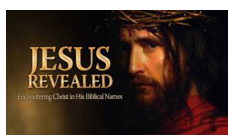

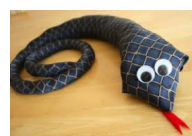

From the Pope's Wednesday Audiences

To illustrate the beauty of the Eucharistic celebration, I would like to begin with a very simple aspect: Mass is prayer; rather, it is prayer *par excellence*, the loftiest, the most sublime, and at the same time the most “concrete”. In fact it is the loving encounter with God through his Word and the Body and Blood of Jesus. It is an encounter with the Lord...Praying, as every true dialogue, is also knowing how to be in silence — in dialogues there are moments of silence — in silence together with Jesus. When we go to Mass, perhaps we arrive five minutes early and begin to chat with the person next to us. But this is not the moment for small talk; it is the moment of silence to prepare ourselves for the dialogue. It is the moment for recollection within the heart, to prepare ourselves for the encounter with Jesus. Silence is so important! Remember what I said last week: we are not going to a spectacle, we are going to the encounter with the Lord, and silence prepares us and accompanies us. Pausing in silence with Jesus. From this mysterious silence of God springs his Word which resonates in our heart. Jesus himself teaches us how it is truly possible to “be” with the Father and he shows us this with his prayer. The Gospels show us Jesus who withdraws to secluded places to pray; seeing his intimate relationship with God, the disciples feel the desire to be able to take part in it, and they ask him: “Lord, teach us to pray” (Luke 11.1).

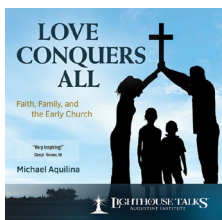
