Dear Friends in Christ,

The liturgical calendar of the Catholic Church assigns solemnities, feasts, and memorials to fixed dates in the solar calendar, and those celebrations are kept each year on the same assigned date. For example, 28 June - which falls this year on a Thursday - is the memorial of St Irenaeus of Lyons, a bishop and martyr who died in the year 202, and no matter on which day of the week it falls, the memorial of St Irenaeus is always kept on 28 June. Except if it falls on a Sunday.

Every Sunday of the year is a solemnity of the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus - a little Easter, and for this reason, almost no liturgical celebrations take the place of the normal Sunday observance. But there are a few exceptions to that rule. The Presentation of the Lord Jesus in the Temple is on 2 February, and if that date falls on a Sunday in a given year, the Presentation takes precedence. So too do the Solemnities of Saints Peter and Paul on 29 June, the Transfiguration of the Lord on 6 August, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on 14 September, and the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (the Cathedral Church of Rome) on 9 November. And to that list we must add today's solemnity: the Nativity of St John the Baptist.

If this Sunday were not 24 June, then it would simply be the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time, also called the 12th Sunday of the Year. But because today is 24 June, we keep instead the liturgical celebration of the birth of the cousin and forerunner of the Lord, St John the Baptist. But why is the feast of the birth of John the Baptist always on 24 June? Because Holy Scripture tells us that John was conceived and therefore born six months before the Lord Jesus, and Christmas Eve is six months from today.

Speaking of the Lord Jesus and of himself, John the Baptist said, "He must increase; I must decrease." (John 3.30) For this reason St Augustine found it particularly appropriate that the births of John and the Lord Jesus should be celebrated so near the summer and winter solstices. The nights begin to grow longer as we remember the birth of John, and the days begin to grow longer when we rejoice in the birth of Christ.

But even these considerations do not tell why the birth of John the Baptist should replace the usual Sunday celebration when 24 June coincides with the Lord's Day, and for that explanation we turn to the Savior himself. When asked about the prophecy that Elijah must precede the coming of the Messiah, the Lord Jesus explained that Elijah's mission was fulfilled by John the Baptist, whom Christ called the greatest man of woman born. And it was John who both baptized the Lord Jesus and then pointed to him with saving faith: Behold, the Lamb of God!

The foundation of Catholic teaching on Social Justice is our respect of all human life and the dignity to be afforded to every human person.

But what does Justice mean in this context?

We most commonly think of justice as the punishment due to a person who has done wrong, or perhaps the compensation due to a person who has been wronged. As a virtue, however, Justice can be basically understood as giving that which is rightly due to God (worship owing to His divinity) and to each individual (respect, food, shelter, clothing, medical, etc. owing to their human dignity).

While our Lord Jesus made it clear that we who are able have an obligation to care for those in need, and while the Catechism reminds us of "The duty of making oneself a neighbor to others and actively serving them..." (CCC 1932), the truth is that we who give a little of our time and talents to serve those in need receive abundantly more in return than we give. The need is great – but too often we simply don't know where the needs are or who can point us in the right direction.



A New Education Savings Opportunity

for Current and Prospective Catholic Schools Families

> The 2017 Tax Cut and Jobs Act now allows families to use expanded 529 savings plans to invest funds for K12 tuition in addition to higher education expenses. Here's what you need to know.

What is a 529 plan?

Named after section 529 of the tax code, the 529 plan is a tax-advantaged plan operated by a state or an education institution designed to encourage saving for college. The federal tax advantage is that earnings on funds contributed to 529 accounts are not federally taxed when withdrawals are used for educational purposes. As of January 1, 2018, 529 plans may be used for K-12 education tuition. For more information, visit www.futurescholar.com.

What are the tax advantages of saving money with a 529 plan?

The primary benefit of a plan is that any earnings from growth over time are tax-free if they are used to pay for qualified education expenses. Secondly, contributions to a plan may be eligible for a State income deduction depending on where you live.

Who may open a 529 plan?

Parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, godparents, and just about anyone else can give the gift of a Catholic education by opening a 529 plan for a child in their preferred state. At the age of 18, students may open plans for themselves.

Is more than one account per child permissible?

Yes! Multiple friends or family members may open separate accounts for a child or contribute to one single plan. If there is more than one child, accounts may be opened for each child.

Is there a maximum amount that can be used to pay K12 tuition?

Yes, the maximum amount that can be distributed tax-free per calendar year is \$10,000 per student, regardless of the number of 529 accounts.

I already started a 529 plan to save for my child's college expenses. Should I use that money to pay for K12 tuition?

This is an important question to discuss with your financial advisor.

How do I enroll in a 529 plan?

You may enroll directly with a State 529 plan manager or with your financial advisor. Please visit www.futurescholar.com to sign up.

Anything else I should consider?

Please consult with your financial advisor or accountant to determine the specific state requirements and select the best option for your family.

What does the Catholic Church believe regarding parental choice in education?

The Declaration on Christian Education, *Gravissimum Educationis*, proclaimed during the Second Vatican Council, neatly summarizes parental choice in education as the following: *Parents who have the primary and inalienable right and duty to educate their children must enjoy true liberty in their choice of schools.* While the expansion of 529 plans does not address all the concerns regarding inequities in our education system, it is a step in the right direction.


