Dear Friends in Christ,

Twenty-five years ago this Tuesday, it was so hot and humid in Charleston that walking from your car to the church was like going for a swim. But that made the day only more memorable! I had been preparing for that day for years, and at last all was ready. Bishop David Thompson ordained Father Timothy Lijewski and me to the priesthood for the Diocese of Charleston on 10 July 1993, and we began our life's work.

For me that meant going back to Rome for one more year to complete my degree in canon law at the Gregorian University, so my first year as a priest was spent in the Eternal City, celebrating Mass in the great basilicas and in the chapels of the Pontifical North American College where I was in residence. The NAC is the American seminary in Rome, and my five years there were a blessing beyond all telling.

When I returned to the diocese in the Summer of 1994, my first assignment was to be Catholic chaplain to The Citadel, and no better beginning to my ministry could have been found. But that was the moment when the declining number of priests in the diocese required the realignment of our ministries, and so I was the last full-time Catholic chaplain at The Citadel. For one year I served as pastor of St Mark's, Newberry and St Boniface, Joanna, and then for four years I was pastor of Divine Redeemer, Hanahan. In my final year there, Robert Baker became the Bishop of Charleston, and he had a long connection to a seminary in Columbus, Ohio that is both an undergraduate college and a graduate school of theology. So I was sent to the Pontifical College Josephinum to serve as professor of canon law and dean of men for the undergraduate seminarians. That assignment was meant to last for several years, but in the first few months after I left for Ohio, our diocesan presbyterate was shaken by the resignation from ministry of two priests and the sudden deaths of three priests, including our finest young priest who died in a car accident at age 31 on the Solemnity of the Epiphany. The tragic death of Father Scott Buchanan, a close friend of mine, was a severe loss to the diocese, but it also changed the course of my life because it led to Bishop Baker's decision to send me to St Mary's.

And so I arrived here to begin my service as the sixteenth pastor of St Mary's on 28 June 2001, and those who were here at the time will recall that I said at my installation that I expected this to be my last assignment. Given my peripatetic history to that time, skepticism about that claim was to be expected, but seventeen years later, here I am. It is said that if you want to make God laugh, you should tell him your plans, and that is doubly true of priests who do not decide where they live and work. But if I have a full span of years, I expect that you will be invited to my retirement party on 10 July 2038, the 45th anniversary of my ordination and the end of 37 years of service to St Mary's! For now, however, please join me today at 5 pm for Vespers and a reception in Gallivan Hall as I give thanks to God for these 25 years of priestly ministry.



The foundation of Catholic teaching on Social Justice is our respect of all human life and the dignity to be afforded to every human person.

But what does Justice mean in this context?

We most commonly think of justice as the punishment due to a person who has done wrong, or perhaps the compensation due to a person who has been wronged. As a virtue, however, Justice can be basically understood as giving that which is rightly due to God (worship owing to His divinity) and to each individual (respect, food, shelter, clothing, medical, etc. owing to their human dignity).

While our Lord Jesus made it clear that we who are able have an obligation to care for those in need, and while the Catechism reminds us of "The duty of making oneself a neighbor to others and actively serving them..." (CCC 1932), the truth is that we who give a little of our time and talents to serve those in need receive abundantly more in return than we give. The need is great – but too often we simply don't know where the needs are or who can point us in the right direction.



A New Education Savings Opportunity

for Current and Prospective Catholic Schools Families

> The 2017 Tax Cut and Jobs Act now allows families to use expanded 529 savings plans to invest funds for K12 tuition in addition to higher education expenses. Here's what you need to know.

What is a 529 plan?

Named after section 529 of the tax code, the 529 plan is a tax-advantaged plan operated by a state or an education institution designed to encourage saving for college. The federal tax advantage is that earnings on funds contributed to 529 accounts are not federally taxed when withdrawals are used for educational purposes. As of January 1, 2018, 529 plans may be used for K-12 education tuition. For more information, visit www.futurescholar.com.

What are the tax advantages of saving money with a 529 plan?

The primary benefit of a plan is that any earnings from growth over time are tax-free if they are used to pay for qualified education expenses. Secondly, contributions to a plan may be eligible for a State income deduction depending on where you live.

Who may open a 529 plan?

Parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, godparents, and just about anyone else can give the gift of a Catholic education by opening a 529 plan for a child in their preferred state. At the age of 18, students may open plans for themselves.

Is more than one account per child permissible?

Yes! Multiple friends or family members may open separate accounts for a child or contribute to one single plan. If there is more than one child, accounts may be opened for each child.

Is there a maximum amount that can be used to pay K12 tuition?

Yes, the maximum amount that can be distributed tax-free per calendar year is \$10,000 per student, regardless of the number of 529 accounts.

I already started a 529 plan to save for my child's college expenses. Should I use that money to pay for K12 tuition?

This is an important question to discuss with your financial advisor.

How do I enroll in a 529 plan?

You may enroll directly with a State 529 plan manager or with your financial advisor. Please visit www.futurescholar.com to sign up.

Anything else I should consider?

Please consult with your financial advisor or accountant to determine the specific state requirements and select the best option for your family.

What does the Catholic Church believe regarding parental choice in education?

The Declaration on Christian Education, *Gravissimum Educationis*, proclaimed during the Second Vatican Council, neatly summarizes parental choice in education as the following: *Parents who have the primary and inalienable right and duty to educate their children must enjoy true liberty in their choice of schools.* While the expansion of 529 plans does not address all the concerns regarding inequities in our education system, it is a step in the right direction.




Men's Discernment Retreat
