

Dear Friends in Christ,

The seven Sacraments of the New Covenant are divinely instituted instruments of grace given to the Church as the ordinary means of sanctification for believers. Receiving the Sacraments regularly and worthily is essential to the life of grace, and for this reason, faithful attendance at Sunday Mass every week (serious illness and necessary work aside) and regular Confession of sins are absolutely required for a life of authentic discipleship. This is the Third Principle of Evangelical Catholicism.

In the first chapter of his letter to the Ephesians, St Paul teaches us that we exist to live for the praise of God's glory. This is a bold claim! If we exist to praise God, then until we worship Him according to the eternal plan of salvation revealed in Jesus Christ, we are not yet living a whole or a holy human life. In other words, a person who does not give thanks to God each week in the Most Holy Eucharist does not yet fully understand why he exists or how to find his eternal destiny. From the creation of the world, the Seventh Day was set aside for us from ordinary occupations so that we could share in the covenantal worship which completes and perfects our humanity, and the Passover meal of Israel was set by God as a perpetual remembrance of their deliverance from slavery so that they would never return to the condition of slaves. In his passion, death, and Resurrection, the Lord Jesus transformed the Passover of the Old Covenant into the Eucharist of the New and Everlasting Covenant, and for Christians the observance of the Sabbath moved to the Day of Resurrection, the Lord's Day on which we share each week in the Passover of the Lamb of God. But if all this true, why do so many Catholics not attend Mass every Sunday?

I don't get anything out of it. It's boring. I don't like the music. These are among the answers typically offered by non-practicing Catholics when asked why they don't attend Mass each Sunday. But those answers reveal a much deeper problem. People who don't attend Mass because "they don't get anything out of it" are revealing that they are not yet authentic disciples of the Lord Jesus who understand the cost of discipleship. We are not called to Mass to get anything; we are called to Mass to give something. In fact, we are called to give everything. We must offer our whole lives as a sacrifice of praise in and with the sacrifice of Christ, and in so doing we fulfill the command of the Lord Jesus given at the Last Supper: "Do this in remembrance of me." And when once we have learned to worship God in this fashion, then we find that we do receive something. We receive divine mercy, the forgiveness of our sins, the light of the Gospel to illuminate the mysteries of life, the strength to take up our cross and follow Christ, and the nourishment of the Body and Blood of Christ which is the pledge of eternal life and the medicine of immortality. And going to Confession whenever needed is Christ's Easter gift to the Church and an essential preparation for our worthy participation in the Eucharist. Since we exist for the praise of God's glory, let's use the tools He himself has given us to worship Him in spirit and truth.

Meet Mike Munafo



For 3 years after retiring Mike was constantly telling himself that he was going to give back some of his time by volunteering to help those in need. "It wasn't until I was asked that I actually answered the call that was in my heart those 3 years. I looked at my life and saw someone who was always busy, but wasn't accomplishing anything" Mike told me. Among other things, Mike now spends part of his free time bringing Holy Communion to those who are not able to come to mass. "It is such an honor and blessing to carry the gift of our Lord to those in need. I am both humbled and privileged to serve our Lord in this ministry. Truthfully, I don't know who gets a greater blessing out of this, me or those who I serve" said Mike.

In the spare time Mike has now that he's retired, he takes Holy Communion to patients in both Greenville Memorial and St. Francis hospitals as well as to a homebound person. Mike told me that he is humbled by seeing those spouses and family members who care for their loved one's week after week while battling life threatening illnesses. "When I come into their room, it is not me that they see, but Jesus who I am bringing to them. I have been blessed with good health, this ministry is, in some small way, my way of saying 'Thank you' to the Lord for all he has given to me".

We, the people of God, are the Church. When we serve those in need, it is the Church, us, the body of Christ, who are serving – and it is our family that we serve. There are many in our faith family who, because of advanced age, illness, or physical limitations are not able to attend mass. In addition to suffering loneliness, in their separation they frequently feel like they are no longer part of the Church community. There is a great need for faithful men and women who are willing to spend 1 hour a week, every other week, or just one hour a month bringing the gift of the Lord and of the Church to them.


