Dear Friends in Christ,


The sacred liturgy, through which the seven Sacraments are celebrated and the Hours of praise are prayed, makes present to us the saving mysteries of the Lord Jesus. The liturgy must therefore be celebrated in such a way that the truth of the Gospel, the beauty of sacred music, the dignity of ritual form, the solemnity of divine worship, and the fellowship of the baptized assembled to pray are kept together in organic unity. This is the Fifth Principle of Evangelical Catholicism.

Protestants who become Catholics often remark that they miss the sense of fellowship they experienced in their former congregations - the feeling of belonging to a group of friends in a spiritual family rather than joining a crowd of random strangers coming together for a common purpose as at an athletic event or concert. This is part of what I mean in the Fifth Principle by "the fellowship of the baptized assembled to pray."

One of the ways that sense of fellowship is fostered in Protestant congregations is that people in the pews speak to each other in conversational voices before worship begins. This is often called visiting, and it can help form a group of people into a spiritual family. But Catholics do not speak to each other in the pews before Mass because we are speaking to God: preparing in silent prayer to participate in the sacred liturgy by turning our hearts and minds to the Throne of Grace so that the truth of the Gospel, the beauty of sacred music, the dignity of ritual form, and the solemnity of divine worship can unite us body and soul as closely as possible to the Lord Jesus Christ. But such a Christ-centered way of praying in union with the whole Church around the world should not impede us from finding other ways to foster fellowship in our parishes, and that is why lingering after Mass to converse with each other, joining other Catholics in service to those in need, and participating in social and recreational events are so important. Look for ways to cultivate friendships with those you see around you in the pews so that the vertical and horizontal dimensions of parish life reinforce each other rather than compete with each other.

And if you want to understand more deeply why the Church asks us to pray as we do, I recommend two short texts. The first to read is *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of the Second Vatican Council; it is only a few pages long, and the text is available online. Then read *The Spirit of the Liturgy* by Joseph Ratzinger (later Pope Benedict XVI), a beautiful meditation on the nature and purpose of liturgical worship by the finest theological mind of our time. The psalmist sings that we are created "to worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness," and the sacred liturgy is meant always to lead us to the Lord Jesus. An essential part of the New Evangelization is the full and faithful celebration of the sacred liturgy, and that is what we strive for in all our prayer. Let us go together to the source and summit of the Church's life and find there a glimpse of the New and Eternal Jerusalem.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Anger, shame, sorrow and grief - that is what I feel in the face of the sins committed by so many bishops and priests. I find it truly sickening and heartbreaking to know that children and adults have been betrayed and harmed by clergy and Church leaders whom they trusted. I join other bishops in apologizing for what we "have done and failed to do." This is a grave sin.

Countless clergy and laity across the United States are horrified by the news reports in the last several weeks, especially this past week. I fully understand that you have lost trust in the leadership of the Church. We are all horrified and humiliated that far too many bishops and priests, who were consecrated to God by solemn promises and the anointing of the Holy Spirit, have betrayed the grace of their ordination and failed to live as faithful disciples of the Lord Jesus. This has been done in ways that have seriously injured innocent young lives and the faithful of God. However, for Christians, anger, shame and disgust should never have the last word.

Now is a time for contrite, heartfelt confession and a firm commitment to make amends and reparation for our sins. This begins with repentance and begging forgiveness from God, and receiving His forgiveness with the intent to go forth and sin no more.

To all who have suffered sexual abuse at the hands of predatory priests and complicit bishops, I am profoundly sorry. We have failed you and you were robbed of your childhood. By coming forward you have enabled others to know that they are not alone in their anguish. You have awakened the Church and in doing so have protected, and will protect, many other children from this horror.

To all whose faith has been undermined, I share your outrage and feelings of betrayal. I humbly ask your forgiveness. I need your help so that we can move forward together as the Body of Christ.

Where do we go from here? The work of conversion includes all of us and especially bishops and priests. In fact, specifically in our own diocese, it must begin with me. I give you my word as your shepherd that in the coming months and years I will work with my fellow bishops, the priests of our diocese, and all Catholics of good will to seek reform within the Church. I promise you that in the Diocese of Charleston we are working diligently to insure that these vile crimes never again happen here.

As people of faith we rely upon the Gospel as we move from darkness to light, sin to redemption, despair to hope. We journey together in the context of a believing community. We rely not on our own efforts but on the Holy Spirit who strengthens and sustains us in the most difficult of times. In the face of this challenge, we remember the words of St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians, "I can do all things in Christ who strengthens me" (Phil 4:13).

Please pray for me and let us all pray for one another.

he abortion rate in the United States has been steadily falling since 1980, when it peaked at 29.3 abortions per 1000 women of child-bearing age. In 2014, the most recent year of available data, the rate dropped to 14.6 - below that of 1973 - the year that abortion on demand became legal in the United States. There are many factors that have been contributing to this reduction. Among them are public education, pre-abortion ultrasound requirements, direct intervention and of course, prayer. All of this sounds like - and is - good news, but looked at from a different angle, we can easily see that we've still got a long way to go. Although 2014 saw an over 50% reduction in the abortion rate in this country since Roe v. Wade, the number of abortions performed that year exceeded 925,000. Yes, we've still got our work cut out for us in defending the lives of the unborn.

#### Meet Mary Jo & Jon Falkosky



Every Saturday, rain or shine, freezing or high/humid temperatures, a group of Catholics from several churches in our area pray the Rosary of the Unborn at the abortion facility on Grove Rd. Alongside, a group of our Protestant brothers and sisters pray for the babies, the staff and the abortionists. "At least once a month we all come together to sing Amazing Grace," said Mary Jo, "It is also a great time to share our Catholic faith with our Protestant friends." Prayer is powerful and necessary – but direct intervention is also needed – so in addition to prayer warriors, there are trained "sidewalk counselors" from both the Catholic and Protestant communities who are there to offer information and counseling to mothers who are on their way to have abortions. "So many don't realize what abortion really is and how they will be changed for the rest of their lives," Mary Jo told me. We know that our prayers are effective, and we can see that effect in the changing of public opinion against abortion on demand and the numerous laws enacted to restrict abortions in recent years. Still, one of the greatest joys for those who go to the abortion clinic to pray is seeing a woman or a couple who were on their way to abort their baby, turn around and decide for life. "We are abundantly blessed knowing our prayers and efforts have been instrumental in saving a child's life." Mary Jo reminds us that the need for prayer and direct intervention to end abortion remains as important as ever. "The first time I came to pray was over 12 years ago and I knew I had to come every week I possibly could. We encourage everyone, young and old, couples and families with children, anyone, to come and spend one hour a week to unite and pray. There are some who have been praying for over 20 years and have seen 2 abortion facilities close."

#### COME AND SEE - LAY DOMINICANS


