Dear Friends in Christ,

The good news about controlling the pandemic continues to gather and grow, and the sooner everyone is vaccinated, the sooner all restrictions on public life can be relaxed. I received my first dose of the Pfizer vaccine last week at Bon Secours Saint Francis Hospital, and I encourage everyone to get vaccinated as soon as you are eligible to do so. Although the Church does not teach that there is a moral obligation to receive a Covid-19 vaccination, it is also true that the Catholic Church teaches that there is no religious exemption from receiving vaccinations in general, and a strong argument can be made that love of neighbor impels us to receive this particular vaccine unless prevented from doing so by a clinical reason indicated by a physician.

One consequence of the long trend downwards in the key indicators for the virus is that no reservation will be required to attend the sacred liturgies of Holy Week. Gallivan Hall will remain open for as long as it is needed, and anyone who desires extra space for themselves or their family is welcome and encouraged to attend Mass in the Hall and receive Holy Communion there. But anyone who wants to attend Mass in the church and does not mind the close company of others is welcome to do so, provided that you continue to observe the standard precautions of not coming if you have a fever or a persistent cough or have been have exposed to someone with the virus or even simply don't feel well. In case of any of those symptoms, please watch the livestream of our liturgies on our parish Facebook page.

The only restrictions which remain in place for now are that the confessionals and cry rooms are still closed, Confessions are heard in the cry rooms only, and the procession for Holy Communion will remain single file. In the coming weeks, I anticipate that the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will be replaced with targeted dispensations for those who are still at high risk of serious consequences from Covid-19, but we will wait for word from our Bishop Robert on those changes. For now, though, if you are eating in restaurants, socializing with friends, or going to athletic events, there is no reason not to attend Mass.

At the suggestion of the Vatican, there will be two small changes from our normal celebration of the Paschal Triduum. First, on Maundy Thursday during the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the rite of the Washing of Feet will be omitted, and on Good Friday during the Passion of the Lord, no one will kiss the foot of the Cross. Instead, everyone will venerate the Cross by a simple genuflection or bow and then continue back to their seat. Otherwise, all liturgies from Palm Sunday through Easter Sunday will be celebrated in the usual way and according to our customary schedule. Please see the eBulletin for a complete list of all liturgies during Holy Week, and plan now to join us for the summit of the liturgical year in the annual celebration of the Passover of the Lord.

Established in 1998 to support Catholic women of the parish in their academic endeavors, the members of the SMCCW are proud to continue this award, now in its 23rd year!


This award is available for both high school graduating female parishioners planning to attend an institution of higher education and female parishioners who are currently enrolled in a continuing education program.



Gallivan Hall is open during every weekend Mass to provide plenty of room for everyone. Mass is clearly visible and audible in Gallivan Hall thanks to our cinema screen and sound system, and the rest rooms to the left of the stage will be open.

All pews in the church are now open for seating; however, we continue to encourage social distancing and the wearing of a face mask. Our cry rooms remain closed because proper distancing is not possible in those spaces, and for now Confessions are being heard in the cry rooms on Saturday from 3.30 - 4.30 pm. The Wednesday afternoon Holy Hour has returned from 5.00 - 6.00 pm.

Finally, the dispensation from the Sunday obligation remains in force, which means that no one is required to attend Mass, even though all must find a way to keep the Lord's Day holy, and the best way to do that is by joining in the sacred liturgy live-streamed on Sunday morning at 11 am. 
