Dear Friends in Christ,

Now that the emergency is over and the obligation to attend Mass has returned, it is time to think about how to prepare for, participate in, and profit from the celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist each Sunday. So, to assist you in recovering the virtues proper to full, conscious, and active participation in the sacred liturgy, I offer you these recommendations:

Study the Scripture lessons appointed for the day before you leave home for Mass. Leave in plenty of time to arrive at church early, park your car, find a seat, and prepare yourself for the liturgy by silent prayer. Join in the celebration with body and voice, heart and mind by standing, kneeling, bowing, genuflecting, speaking, and singing with the other members of the congregation. Give your entire life as a sacrifice of praise to God in union with Christ who sacrificed his life to free us from the grave. Be reverent, grateful, and recollected throughout the liturgy. If your mind strays, gently bring it back to the Lord Jesus and focus on the Lord.

Receive Holy Communion only if you are in full communion with the Church and properly disposed to do so. This includes receiving the Sacrament of Penance as needed, being married only in the Church, keeping the proper fast, and seeking to live in peace with all people. If you should not receive Holy Communion, then you may receive a blessing or even remain in your pew while lifting up your heart to the Throne of Grace. If you do receive Holy Communion, do so reverently by making an appropriate gesture as an act of faith before the Lord Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament, and this could be a sign of the cross, a bow, or a genuflection.

You may always receive Holy Communion on the tongue, and this is the method preferred by the Church. But if you receive Communion in the hand, place one open palm directly on top of the other open palm. Allow the sacred Host to be placed fully on your hand, and do not reach for the Host from the Communion minister. Then before you walk away, reverently consume the Host and never continue walking with the Host.

After receiving Holy Communion, return to your pew and give thanks for the medicine of immortality, and never leave the church immediately after receiving Holy Communion. To leave before the end of Mass is a grave act of irreverence and ingratitude, and no one should ever do that for any reason. If you must leave the church before the liturgy is over, it is better by far not to receive Holy Communion and instead to pray for a spiritual communion with the Lord Jesus and to ask yourself what is so urgent that you cannot remain for the entire celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist.

In all of these ways we can enter together into the sacred worship of the Lord's Day, and fulfill the command of the Savior: Do this in remembrance of me.



Would you like to jump-start communication with your son or daughter? Do you need help in talking to your child about chastity, sexuality, marriage, dating and other important topics? Would you like to spend time with other families who share your values and want the best for their children? Would you like to do all this in an environment that is relaxed, fun and respects the dignity of everyone present?

If you answered YES to any of these questions and you're the parent of a 7th, 8th or 9th grader, we encourage you to register for the *Real Love & Real Life* parent-teen chastity education retreat, to be held at Our Lady of The Rosary Catholic Church on 30 & 31 July. Friday 30 July will be from 7.00 - 9.15 pm, and Saturday 31 July will be from 9.00 am - 2.00 pm. Lunch will be provided to participants on Saturday.

This fun and truly unique three-session retreat is for you to attend with your child. You'll see and hear skits, videos, participate in group breakout sessions and interactive games. It will bring you together with other parish families to learn about love, life, chastity and God's gift of sexuality. You and your teen will have the chance to enhance your communication skills, discuss true worth, guidelines for future dating and lots more. Here, one parent shares what they liked most about the retreat. "It opened a door for me that wasn't open before between my daughter and me. I definitely feel more comfortable and confident discussing chastity with her."

The *Real Love & Real Life* retreat is presented by Family Honor Inc., an organization that has provided and promoted a family-centered Catholic approach to chastity education since 1988. There is a registration fee of \$45 per family (\$15 extra if someone is bringing two teens) for the retreat, which can be paid upon checking in at the first session. Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often

you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as <u>Inactive</u> and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@stmarysgvl.org

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish.




30 for 30 Prayer Campaign

Vocations Camps in North Carolina



Quo Vadis Days is a five-day vocations discernment camp for young men at Belmont Abbey College. The camp includes talks by local priests, seminarians, and others on the vocations to the priesthood, marriage, and fatherhood.

Ultimately, the goal of our Quo Vadis Days is to challenge young men to ask the fundamental question "quo vadis" or "where are you going?", while equipping them with the tools and opportunity to discern God's will for their life.
