Dear Friends in Christ,

As we read last Sunday, the Lord Jesus once taught a crowd on the shore of the Sea of Galilee while he was sitting in the boat of the brothers Simon and Andrew, and from that fishing boat comes a beloved image of the Church: the Barque of Peter. When a group of people are on board a boat, no matter how large it may be, they are stuck with each other, and the experience of being together in this way can either enhance a sense of solidarity or exacerbate disagreements.

In the past few years the Church has been roiled many times by disagreements over doctrine and sacramental discipline, and these disputes are invariably framed by the secular media as struggles within the Church by enlightened progressives to help Catholics make peace with the sexual revolution and abandon outmoded ways of thinking when, in fact, the struggle is usually between those who seek to live in fidelity to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and those who think the Gospel can and should be changed to suit their preferences.

These disputes, which are increasingly public in nature, have several times divided bishops from each other, both within individual countries and between nations. And in the past three weeks two glaring examples of this tendency erupted in Europe with the Cardinal Archbishop of Luxembourg announcing that he thinks the Church's teaching on some dimensions of sexuality is false while the assembly of the German Synodal Way called for the ordination of women to the priesthood and the blessing of same sex friendships as a form of holy matrimony.

Much of the New Testament was written as a corrective to false doctrine and immoral behavior which had been embraced, defended, and advanced by those who had thought of themselves as true disciples of Christ. From the very beginning, the dangers of heresy and schism confronted the Church's pastors with the necessity of constantly clarifying what does and what does not conform to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the sacramental economy of salvation by which the Savior unites us to his Paschal Mystery. Those dangers of heresy and schism will be with the Church until the Last Day, which is why we should never be surprised to find them in our own time.

Friends, Jesus Christ is the Eternal and Incarnate Word, and he is the same yesterday, today, and forever. The Gospel of Jesus Christ, which is the power of God unto salvation for all who have faith, was given once for all to the saints, and the age of revelation ended with the death of the last Apostle, because in Jesus Christ, God the Father has said everything we need to know for our salvation. When quarrels break out on the Barque of Peter, the calm center is to be found in Christ Jesus who alone is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

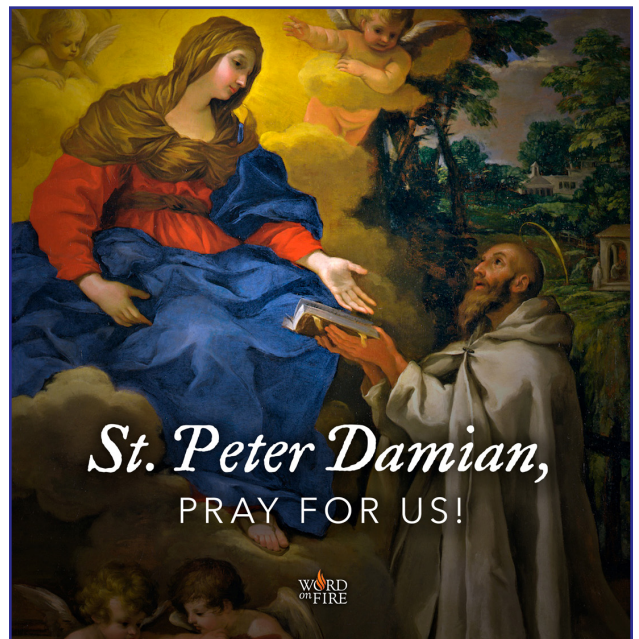

Dr John C. Carrano is an Executive Consultant and the former President and CEO of Paratus Diagnostics, a firm he founded that specializes in medical devices for point-of-care diagnostics. Dr Carrano was previously Vice President, Research & Development at Luminex Corporation (NASDAQ: LMNX). Prior to Luminex, John was as a programmanager at DARPA where he led several major Defense Department programs related to bio-sensing. Dr Carrano was also on the faculty of the Department of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science at the United States Military Academy, and served as the Department Executive Officer. He retired from

the Army in 2005 with over 24 years of decorated service including a variety of command and staff positions worldwide. Dr Carrano received his B.S. from West Point and his Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering from the University of Texas at Austin. He has several patents and over 60 publications and is a Fellow of SPIE. In 2012 he was appointed by Secretary Napolitano to the Department of Homeland Security Science Advisory Board.

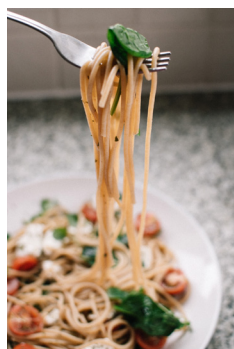
SMCCW 2022 \$1,000 Scholarship Award

Serenity Place Village

Every year, more than 500 children in Greenville County are removed from their home by the state. Serenity Place Village, located near the downtown Bon Secours Hospital, is a residential treatment center for pregnant women, young mothers and their preschool-age children. Each year, about 120 mothers and children find hope, healing and transformation in the program, with each family living on-site for about six months. Up to 48 women and children are in treatment at the Serenity Place village at any given time.

When a young mother and her children enter Serenity Place, the family has already been down a long and dangerous road. The mother is struggling with addiction (often brought on by suffering from physical and mental abuse) and is also likely to be escaping from sexual abuse. Without help, she is just about to lose her children to the foster care system...possibly forever.

The children have suffered through no fault of their own, and often come to us traumatized and confused. Their daily lives have veered from chaos to deadening neglect, without rhyme or reason. They are often delayed on several developmental levels and emotionally unable to connect. Without help, they will be unprepared for any kind of classroom environment.

St Mary's has recently begun a partnership with Serenity Village, which has seen a large increase in the number of newborns and infants. So to kick off our new partnership, we will be having a drive to collect items needed for infants and newborns. Items should be new and in original packaging. Boxes for dropping off items will be located on the main floor of Sacred Heart Hall for collection of donated items on weekends from 19 February - 6 March.

New Senior Life Ministry

St Mary's has a new ministry dedicated primarily to assisting Seniors, but is open to anyone who could benefit from our services. As a new ministry, we are also looking for volunteers that are interested in assisting in any of the services offered by this ministry. The services we provide include:

Resource Information: Are you looking for a handyman to do some minor repairs? Have questions about Senior resources in our community? Looking to move to a smaller place and need help with downsizing all your stuff? We can provide you with resources available in the Upstate and some within our Greenville Catholic Community.

Home Safety Assessment: A 53-point assessment of your living spaces, inside and out, that looks for possible hazards and things you may want to do to increase the safety of living at home in your senior years.

Setting up an "In Case of Death or Incapacity" file: A private file listing a wide variety of information your loved ones will need in the event of your incapacity or death. We will also check to see if you have the legal documents you may need. This is a great resource in helping your loved ones avoid probate court and reducing what will already be a stressful time to them.

Documenting your desired Catholic Funeral Rites: All too often we have Catholics whose family opt out of these important funeral and prayer rituals because they simply do not know or understand the importance of Catholic prayer rituals. This file will specify your desires and can even detail options to your Vigil (Scriptures, songs, etc) if desired.

Homebound Assistance: Are you homebound and periodically need help getting around? Someone to do a quick run to the store? Or someone to just periodically come by and talk? Perhaps you need help with how to watch St Mary's Mass at home or would like someone to bring Holy Communion by once a week.

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often

you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as **Inactive** and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@stmarysgvl.org

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish.

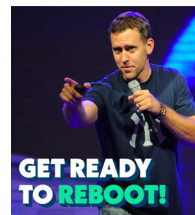
