Dear Friends in Christ,

The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke describe an extraordinary event near the end of the public ministry of the Lord Jesus which is customarily called the Transfiguration in the Christian West and the Metamorphosis in the Christian East. This event is also mentioned in the Second Letter of Peter and perhaps in the Prologue of the Gospel of John. Sacred Scripture does not tell us exactly where and when the Transfiguration took place, but ancient traditions identify the location at Mount Tabor in Galilee and the time as forty days before Good Friday.

What the Gospels teach with certainty is that the Lord Jesus took Peter, James, and John with him up a high mountain to prepare for his coming passion and death, and while Jesus was absorbed in prayer he was joined by Moses and Elijah, representing the Law and the Prophets, who were sent to help him accomplish his passover in Jerusalem by speaking with him about the suffering he would endure. And in that moment, the uncreated light of divine glory which belongs by nature to God the Son was unveiled through his human flesh for a fleeting moment as the voice of God the Father was heard, and the three Apostles who would soon accompany Christ in the garden of Gethsemane beheld the radiant glory of God in the Lord Jesus. This combination of suffering and glory reveals the paradox at the heart of the Gospel and spoken of by the Lord Jesus just before His Transfiguration: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it." (Luke 9.23-24)

The oldest known liturgical celebration of this feast was in the Armenian Church, and the 7th century Armenian Bishop Gregory Arsharuni wrote that the feast was placed in the calendar by Saint Gregory the Illuminator in the early 4th century. In the Orthodox Church, the Feast of the Transfiguration is one of the Twelve Great Feasts of the liturgical year, and it is both preceded by a fast and celebrated with a Vigil and an Octave, in the way Latin Rite Catholics celebrate Christmas and Easter. These liturgical observances underscore the importance of the sacred truths revealed to us by the Transfiguration of the Lord.

The Feast of the Transfiguration, which from antiquity has been kept on 6 August, gradually entered the liturgical life of the Western Church through our monasteries, and by the tenth century this feast was observed in many of the dioceses of England, France and Germany. But despite the importance and widespread celebration of this feast, it was not placed by the pope on the universal calendar of the Roman Rite until the 15th century. The Feast of the Transfiguration is one of the few liturgical celebrations in our calendar that are kept even on Sundays, but this year the feast falls on Saturday. Take time on 6 August to read the account of the Transfiguration in one or more of the Gospels, and give thanks for the glory of God revealed in the life, death, and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ.

## Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often

you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

## Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- Parishioner tuition in the school
- Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as <u>Inactive</u> and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@stmarysgvl.org

## **Baptism Class**



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish.


