Dear Friends in Christ,

The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, commonly called Confession, is one of the sacred mysteries given by the Lord Jesus to his Church for our sanctification, and the regular reception of this sacrament is an essential part of authentic Christian discipleship. Saint John the Evangelist tells us that Christ gave us this gift of grace on Easter Sunday when he first appeared to the frightened and confused Apostles. "Jesus came and stood among them and said to them 'Peace be with you.' When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.' And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld.'" (John 20.19-23)

The administration of the Sacrament of Penance is one dimension of the sacred authority to bind and loose which the Savior entrusted to the Apostles and to their successors, the bishops and priests who serve as instruments of grace for others, and every time we go to Confession, the grace of our Baptism is renewed so that we can follow the Lord Jesus in the Way of the Cross and live the life of the new creation. But many people hesitate to go Confession because they are intimidated by the thought of acknowledging their sins or worried about the human respect of the priest or are simply not certain of what they should do and say. So, in the hope of encouraging everyone to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance regularly, I offer these suggestions:

Remember that Confession is not spiritual direction or pastoral counseling, and it is not the forum for describing our problems in life or sorting through our character flaws. Instead, in the Sacrament of Penance, the penitent simply names his sins and the confessor pronounces absolution for those sins. The priest may or may not ask a question or offer a word of encouragement, but the entire exchange can and ordinarily should be very brief. Anyone who wants counseling or direction is welcome to ask for those, but the Sacrament of Penance serves an entirely different purpose.

Begin by describing your state in life (married or single, age, etc) and telling the confessor the last time you went to Confession. Going to Confession too seldom leads to presumption, and going too often can promote scrupulosity and despair. About once a month is more than enough for nearly everyone, and all Catholics should go at least once each year. Then with humility and simplicity, name the sins you can remember since your last Confession and conclude by saying something like "I am sorry for these and all my sins." The priest will then name a penance to perform as a sign of sorrow for sin and ask for an act of contrition. There are many versions of the act of contrition, but a simple one we know by heart is the best. I recommend "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, have mercy on me, a sinner." Then the priest will speak the words of absolution and send us on our way in the peace which Christ gives us as his Easter gift.



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

World Mission Sunday will be celebrated on Sunday October 22nd, and Pope Francis asks all of us to focus not on the country in which we live, but on the mission fields of our world. Why? Because there are 258,540 Religious Sisters laboring there, there are 844,000 Catechists teaching the faith to the world's villages, there are 38,140 Seminarians studying for the Priesthood, there are 8750 shelters serving the homeless, and there are 26 million children receiving necessary assistance.

In setting the date for World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis has sent a call to each of us to go into our world and proclaim the presence of Christ. To make His love visible and real through missionary work that reaches to the ends of our world. "All of us can contribute to this missionary movement; with our prayers and activities, with material offerings and the offering of our sufferings, and our personal witness."

"Just as the disciples of Emmaus told the others what had taken place along the way (Lk 24:35), so too our proclamation will be a joyful telling of Christ the Lord, his life, his passion, his death and resurrection, and the wonders that his love has accomplished in our lives."

Missio ad Gentes, the Vatican II document on the missionary nature of the Church, reminds us that the Church of Christ is a missionary Church, that the human family has a right to hear the Good News of peace and Salvation, and our God is Emmanuel! The Pontifical Societies for the Propagation of the Faith has the primary responsibility for the Church's missionary work and is always available to you. Under the leadership of Monsignor Lofton and Mrs. Helena Moniz, the office is always ready to help each of you.

I thank you for generous support that you give to the Church's missions, and pray God will grant you many blessings in return.

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you

come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- Parishioner tuition in the school
- Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as <u>Inactive</u> and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgvl.org.

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and

participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. The next class is Monday 11 December at 6.30 pm. Keeping Children and Teens SAFE ONLINE

Computers and mobile devices can be helpful tools for children and teens to learn and grow in faith and fellowship. Unfortunately, the digital world is also full of unsafe and explicit content. You wouldn't hand a teen the car keys without first teaching them how to drive. The same should be true for using technology teach them how to keep themselves and others safe while using it.

You can use the following tips to better protect young people from harm online:

Model appropriate online
behavior for young people. Children
look to their parents to teach and show them the
ways to appropriately use technology. The biggest
influence on what children see as acceptable or
unacceptable is you.

Teach your children not to share private information or images online.

Strangers posing as online friends can try to gain the trust of minors. Personal information such as name, address, and phone number should never be shared with an unknown person. Tell your children to immediately tell a trusted adult if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable.

Limit usage of computers and mobile devices to public spaces in the home.

Not only will this help to prevent young people from accessing unsafe websites, it will also help them to develop safe browsing habits later in life.

Install software that can block or monitor explicit website use. Open access to harmful websites, like those that include pornography, is a constant threat to



young people. Website filters can prevent access to harmful and explicit sites and some can even alert you when such a site is accessed.

Review and discuss the websites yourchild has visited and apps they have

used. Oversight of your child or teen's browsing history and app usage can help to keep them safe online. If you notice your child has browsed an unsafe website or app, discuss why that behavior is harmful. Learn about current apps that could be harmful to children and teenagers, especially those that involve image sharing, private communication, or the illusion of privacy.

Report online exploitation of minors to public authorities. If you become aware of explicit content involving minors, such as solicitation, explicit images or videos, you should submit a report to law enforcement or through resources like CyberTipline from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.
