Dear Friends in Christ,

In last week's column, I reviewed the origin and purpose of the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation and encouraged all Catholics to go to Confession whenever needed, at least once each year and probably not more than once each month to avoid the twin dangers of presumption and scrupulosity. Every time we go to Confession we must name our mortal sins by kind and number and give a general description of our venial sins, but the difference between mortal and venial sins can sometimes be difficult to establish.

The scriptural foundation of this distinction comes from the Apostle and Evangelist Saint John who wrote that "all wrongdoing is sin, but there is sin that does not lead to death." (1 John 5:17) Deadly or mortal sin is an offense so grave that the life of the grace is extinguished in us, while venial sin, though still contrary to the law and love of God, does not separate us from the grace given us in Holy Baptism. This distinction is important because worthy participation in the celebration of Holy Mass is for the forgiveness of all venial sin, and so there is no reason to refrain from receiving Holy Communion at Mass if one's unconfessed sins are venial rather than mortal.

Here we should remember that four of the seven sacraments confer the grace of forgiveness of sins, and they are Baptism, the Anointing of the Sick, Confession, and the Most Holy Eucharist. Of these four, the Eucharist is the most important by far since in that sacrament we receive not a gift from God but God himself, and the other three sacraments of mercy are given to us precisely so that we may worthily receive the Body and Blood of Christ. But a mortal sin is a spiritual wound that kills the life of grace in us, and so when we have an unconfessed mortal sin we should not receive Holy Communion because that is like trying to feed a dead body. In that case, we must go to Confession in order to be prepared once again to receive Holy Communion, and that brings us back to the distinction between mortal and venial sin.

For a sin to be deadly or mortal, three equally important conditions must be fulfilled: 1) The action must be gravely wrong, 2) I must know that it is gravely wrong, and 3) I must freely and deliberately choose to do it anyway. If I do something gravely wrong but either don't fully understand the gravity of my sin or am not fully free to say no to the sin because of force, fear, habit, or compulsion, then although the sin is objectively wrong, my culpability is diminished to such a degree that the sin is not mortal for me. Compulsive and habitual sins, though they may be gravely wrong, are seldom truly mortal sins in the life of the penitent, and like all other venial sins they should be confessed during the Sacrament of Penance but should not prevent the reception of Holy Communion at Mass even before the next Confession. For a deeper review of this doctrine, see the Catechism of the Catholic Church paragraphs 1846 to 1876.

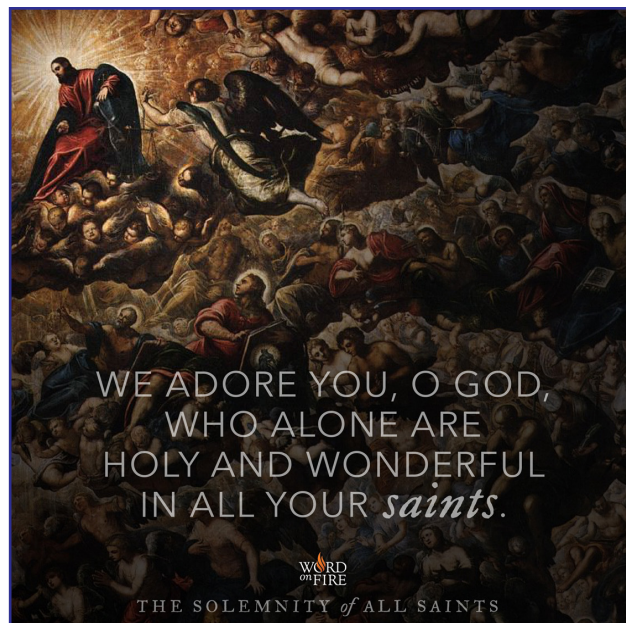

## Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

### Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as **Inactive** and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at [sarah.perkins@smcgv.org](mailto:sarah.perkins@smcgv.org).

## Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. # Keeping Children and Teens **SAFE ONLINE**

Computers and mobile devices can be helpful tools for children and teens to learn and grow in faith and fellowship. Unfortunately, the digital world is also full of unsafe and explicit content. You wouldn't hand a teen the car keys without first teaching them how to drive. The same should be true for using technology—teach them how to keep themselves and others safe while using it.



**You can use the following tips to better protect young people from harm online:**

**1 Model appropriate online behavior for young people.** Children look to their parents to teach and show them the ways to appropriately use technology. The biggest influence on what children see as acceptable or unacceptable is you.

**2 Teach your children not to share private information or images online.** Strangers posing as online friends can try to gain the trust of minors. Personal information such as name, address, and phone number should never be shared with an unknown person. Tell your children to immediately tell a trusted adult if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable.

**3 Limit usage of computers and mobile devices to public spaces in the home.** Not only will this help to prevent young people from accessing unsafe websites, it will also help them to develop safe browsing habits later in life.

**4 Install software that can block or monitor explicit website use.** Open access to harmful websites, like those that include pornography, is a constant threat to

young people. Website filters can prevent access to harmful and explicit sites and some can even alert you when such a site is accessed.

**5 Review and discuss the websites your child has visited and apps they have used.** Oversight of your child or teen's browsing history and app usage can help to keep them safe online. If you notice your child has browsed an unsafe website or app, discuss why that behavior is harmful. Learn about current apps that could be harmful to children and teenagers, especially those that involve image sharing, private communication, or the illusion of privacy.

**6 Report online exploitation of minors to public authorities.** If you become aware of explicit content involving minors, such as solicitation, explicit images or videos, you should submit a report to law enforcement or through resources like CyberTipline from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.

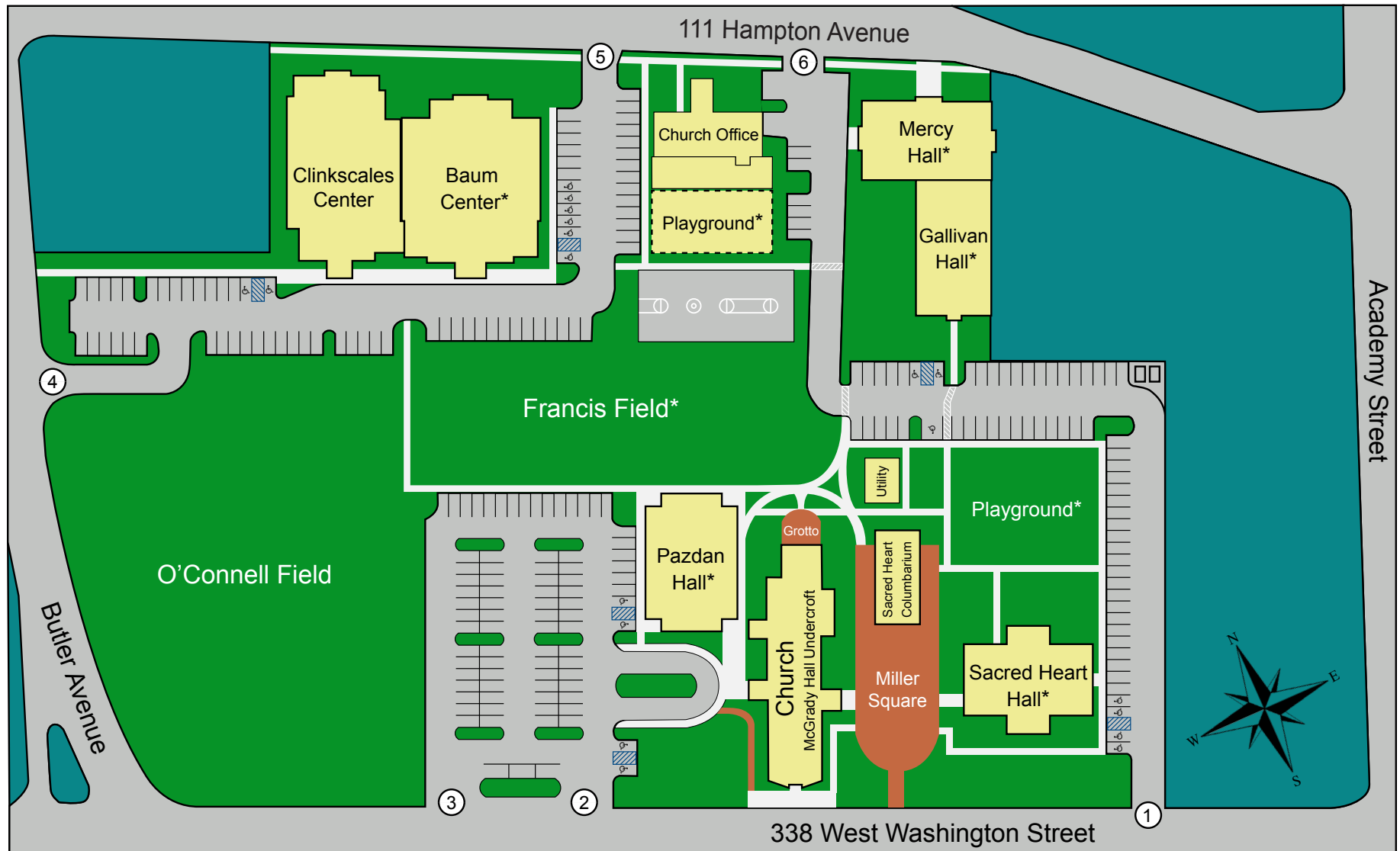




## SAINT MARY'S CAMPUS MAP
