Dear Friends in Christ,

The teaching of the Lord Jesus on the necessity of eating his flesh and drinking his blood in order to receive the gift of everlasting life is as difficult to understand today as it was when he first spoke the words recorded by Saint John in chapter six of his Gospel. (John 6:22-71)

From this teaching and the celebration of Christ's Last Supper at the Passover meal before his atoning death on the Cross, the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist has ever been understood in the Catholic Church as the principal means by which the Lord Jesus remains with us and makes himself present in every time and place where the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar is received by the faithful in divine worship and reserved for adoration. This annual celebration of Corpus Christi reminds us that at every Mass the Lord Jesus comes to us under the appearance of bread and wine to nourish us unto everlasting life with the medicine of immortality.

But the difficulty of this teaching has posed a challenge to those who hear it from the very beginning. Saint John tells us that as a result of Christ's shocking doctrine on eating his flesh and drinking his blood, "many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him." (John 6:66)

In every century since then, those who are drawn to Christ have been challenged to accept this teaching even when such a mystery can never be fully comprehended, and from time to time the Church has been confronted by theological disputations on Christ's real presence in the Holy Eucharist. Those arguments have assisted the Church to clarify her understanding of how the Savior fulfills his promise to give us his flesh as food and his blood as drink, and the liturgical Solemnity of Corpus Christi emerged from one such prolonged theological battle in the twelfth and thirteenth centuries.

To deepen your understanding of this mystery of faith, I recommend that everyone read Part Two, Article Three of the Catechism of the Catholic Church on the Sacrament of the Eucharist (paragraphs 1322 to 1419). There you will find that "the Catholic Church has always offered and still offers to the sacrament of the Eucharist the cult (i.e. worship) of adoration, not only during Mass, but also outside of it, reserving the consecrated hosts with the utmost care, exposing them to the solemn veneration of the faithful, and carrying them in procession." (CCC, 1378)

And that is why on Saturday 1 June we will have a Solemn Eucharistic Procession beginning at 6.15 pm in observance of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. Please join us in lifting up our hearts to the Throne of Grace in thanksgiving for the inestimable gift of Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist, and then stay for the parish picnic.



### Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you

come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

## Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- Parishioner tuition in the school
- Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as <u>Inactive</u> and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgvl.org.

### **Baptism Class**



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and

participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Monday 17 June at 6.30 pm.** Contact Deacon Joe Sanfilippo at 864.679.4119 or joe.sanfilippo@smcgvl.org to register.




A deacon is an ordained minister of the Catholic Church. There are three groups, or orders, of ordained ministers in the Church: bishops, priests, and deacons.

Deacons are ordained for a ministry of service, which they carry out under the authority of the Bishop. All ordained ministers in the Church are called to functions of Word, Altar, and Charity.







Deacons are ordained as a sacramental sign to the Church and to the world of Christ, who came "to serve and not to be served."

THE DIACONATE IS A VOCATION OF LIFE-LONG SERVICE OF WORD, LITURGY AND CHARITY. THE DEACON IS TO EXTEND THE SACRA-MENTAL PRESENCE OF CHRIST'S SERVICE OUTSIDE OF THE CHURCH AND INTO THE SECULAR WORLD.

Proclaim the Gospel and Preach • Teach the Catholic Faith • Evangelize Believers and Unbelievers

#### THE ALTAR

Assist Bishops and Priests at the Liturgy • Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion • Administer the Sacraments of Baptism and Marriage, Preside at Wake Services and Rites of Burial • Preside at Devotional Services

#### **CHARITY**

Perform Charitable, Administrative, and Social Welfare Duties • Visit the Sick, Feed the Hungry • Minister to the Imprisoned • Minister to the Bereaved


#### **Young Adults Spring Retreat**
