Dear Friends in Christ,

The new fiscal year for our parish will begin on 1 July, so it's time to talk about our finances. For the fiscal year just ending, we have a small surplus over our budget, but because of the high inflation that has prevailed for three years now, that surplus has already been expended on general costs for operations. So we once again broke even this year, and that is good news.

The most recent data from the federal government show that in April prices rose 3.4% over the previous year, and in May that rate was 3.3%. So, although progress is slowly being made in controlling the general rate of inflation, everyone should still anticipate a basic increase of 3% and more in the cost for most goods and services.

Accordingly, I am once again asking all households in the parish to increase your offertory contributions by 3% beginning now. This means that if you were giving \$50 per week until now, then your new target would be \$51.50. And if you were giving \$125 per week, then your new target is \$128.75, and so on. If everyone makes this adjustment of 3% to all offertory gifts, then we will once again make our budget goal and be able to fulfill all our financial responsibilities.

The Clinkscales Family Center is now complete, and the total cost of that building and its contents was just shy of \$5.7 million, all of which has been paid thanks to your generosity. And so now we turn our attention to the construction of the church annex to provide handicapped accessible restrooms which can be reached without going outside. The annex will also provide accessible confessionals, a nursery and bride's room, and the choir practice room on the second floor. That same project will also include significant work inside the church, including replacing the pews and kneelers, patching and painting the plaster, and making major improvements and repairs to the pipe organ.

When we know the total cost of this next project, a new capital campaign will begin. And in the meantime, our routine capital needs require us to raise about \$1 million each year to maintain our inviting campus in the heart of the city. Please recall our stewardship guidelines for your tithe: 5% to the parish in offertory gifts, 1% to the diocese in the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina (formerly the BAA), and the remaining 4% to charities of your choice, including our capital improvement fund and periodic campaigns.

Please know that we work very hard to use your gifts wisely and frugally to sustain our beautiful presence in downtown Greenville. The careful stewardship of time, talent, and treasure is an essential part of authentic Christian discipleship, and I am deeply grateful for your sacrificial commitment to Saint Mary's Church.

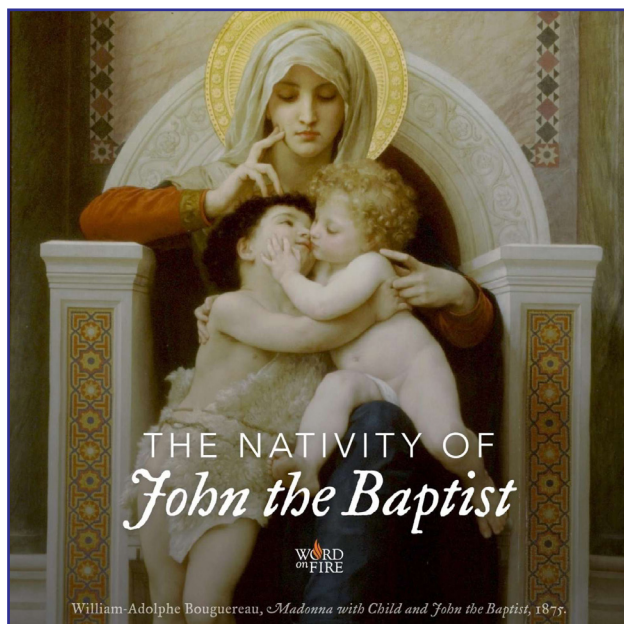

Hello, St Mary's Community!

I wanted to express my immense gratitude for all the prayers and financial support offered to me during my two years spent traveling the country and serving as a missionary with NET Ministries. On 19 May I officially finished my second year of mission and returned home to Greenville, South Carolina.



In my time as a missionary, I was able to conduct roughly 250 retreats for teens ages 12-18, travel across 21 US states, and encounter around 15,000 young people, leading over 1,500 of them individually in small groups. Through this experience, I was able to bring Christ's love to numerous students and see their lives change at realizing this truth.

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as **Inactive** and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgv1.org.

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Monday 16 September at 6.30 pm.** Contact Deacon Joe Sanfilippo at 864.679.4119 or joe.sanfilippo@smcgv1.org to register.

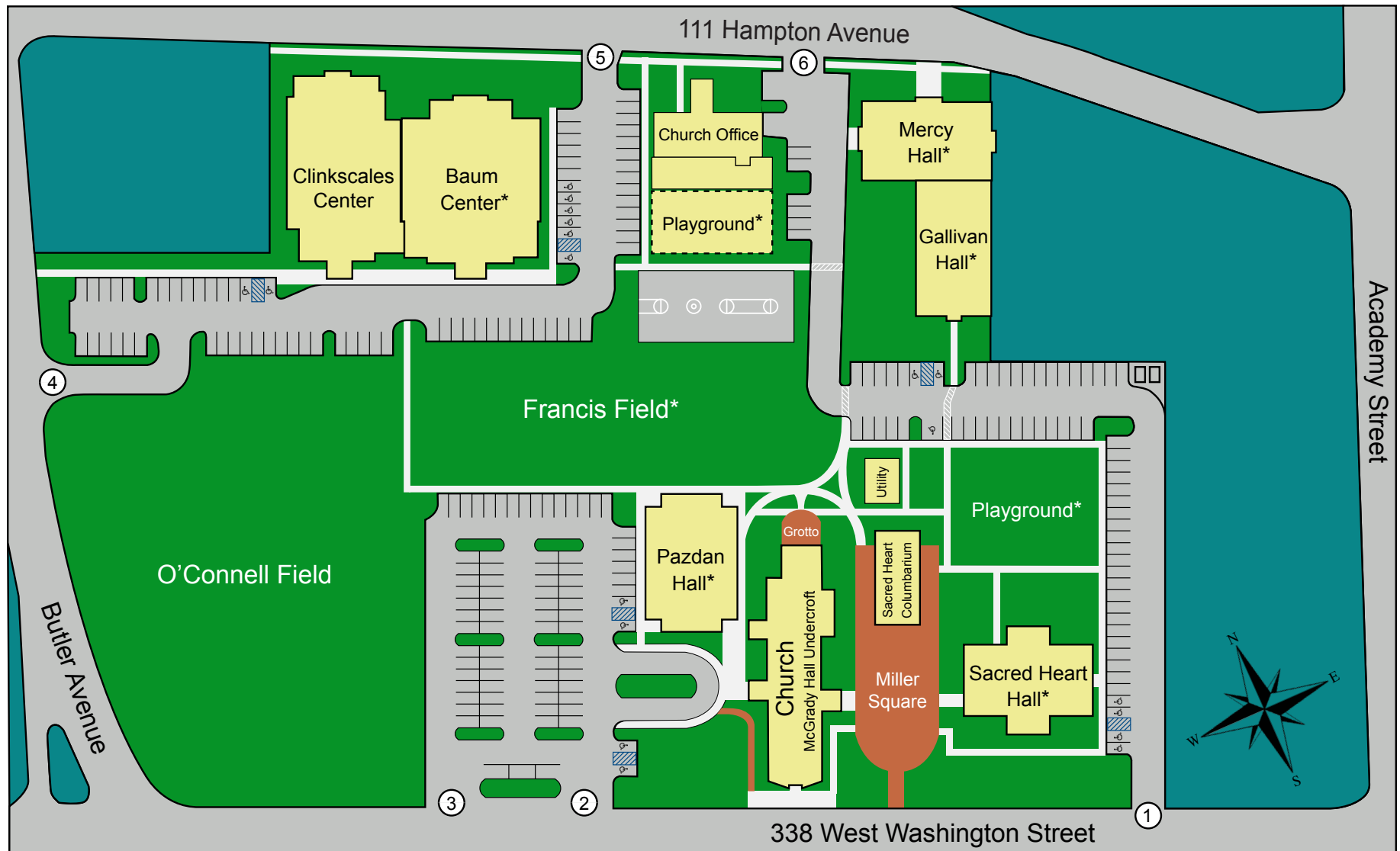
