Dear Friends in Christ,

Saint Mary's Church will be 175 years old in 2027, and we will celebrate that anniversary with a Mass and grand party on Saturday 6 November 2027. Please put that date in your calendars now!

Because of the destruction of records during the Great Fire of Charleston in 1861 we don't know the exact date on which our parish was founded, but I have chosen November 6th for our celebration because that date will be the 123rd anniversary of the dedication of the first half of our church. The original church stretched from the rear wall of the chancel to the side doors which are now in the middle of the building, and the second half was added fifty years later. Then in 2002 we renovated the entire church during our 150th anniversary year.

During the history of our little corner of the vineyard (long in the history of this nation and short in the history of the Church), Saint Mary's has become a refuge of goodness and peace in the midst of the world, and we are blessed beyond all telling to be the current stewards of such a home for the worship of God, the teaching of divine wisdom, the service of those in need, and the fellowship of disciples who seek companions on the Way of the Lord Jesus. And as stewards of these gifts, it is our sacred duty to preserve and enhance what we have received and then to pass along this green and pleasant parish to future generations.

If you have ever felt your pew seat moving beneath you or struggled to trust a kneeler to do its duty, then you know why we must replace all of the pews and kneelers in the church. And the same is true of the wood wainscoting which runs the length of the building and conceals the HVAC equipment from sight. We must also patch and paint the plaster, and it is well past time to prepare our thirty-four year old organ for its next generation of service.

In addition to those tasks, we at long last need to provide indoor rest rooms and accessible confessionals, along with a nursery that can also serve as a bride's room, and that is why we will build an annex to the church in the green space along the sidewalk of Washington Street. It will connect to the church in the spot now occupied by the confessional on the west side of the building, and that connection will allow access to the rest rooms without going outside or climbing stairs.

I don't know if we can accomplish all of these tasks before our 175th anniversary party on 6 November 2027, but we're going to try! A great deal depends on your generosity to our building fund, and so I appeal to you for support as we approach the end of the year. Everything we do here is made possible by your sacrificial gifts, and I am deeply grateful for your commitment to the mission of this parish church dedicated to the Mother of God under the title of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

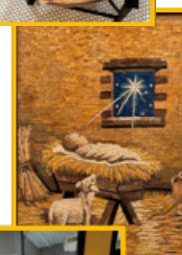
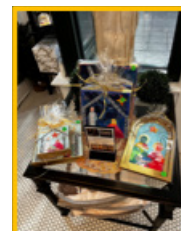
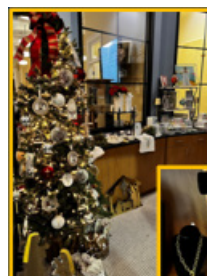


On the First Sunday of Advent, St Mary's volunteers spent the morning preparing, cooking, and serving meals for those in need in our community.

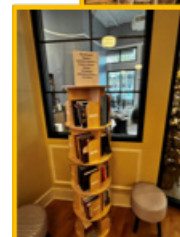

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as **Inactive** and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgv1.org.

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Monday 16 December at 6.30 pm.** Contact Deacon Joe Sanfilippo at 864.679.4119 or joe.sanfilippo@smcgv1.org to register.

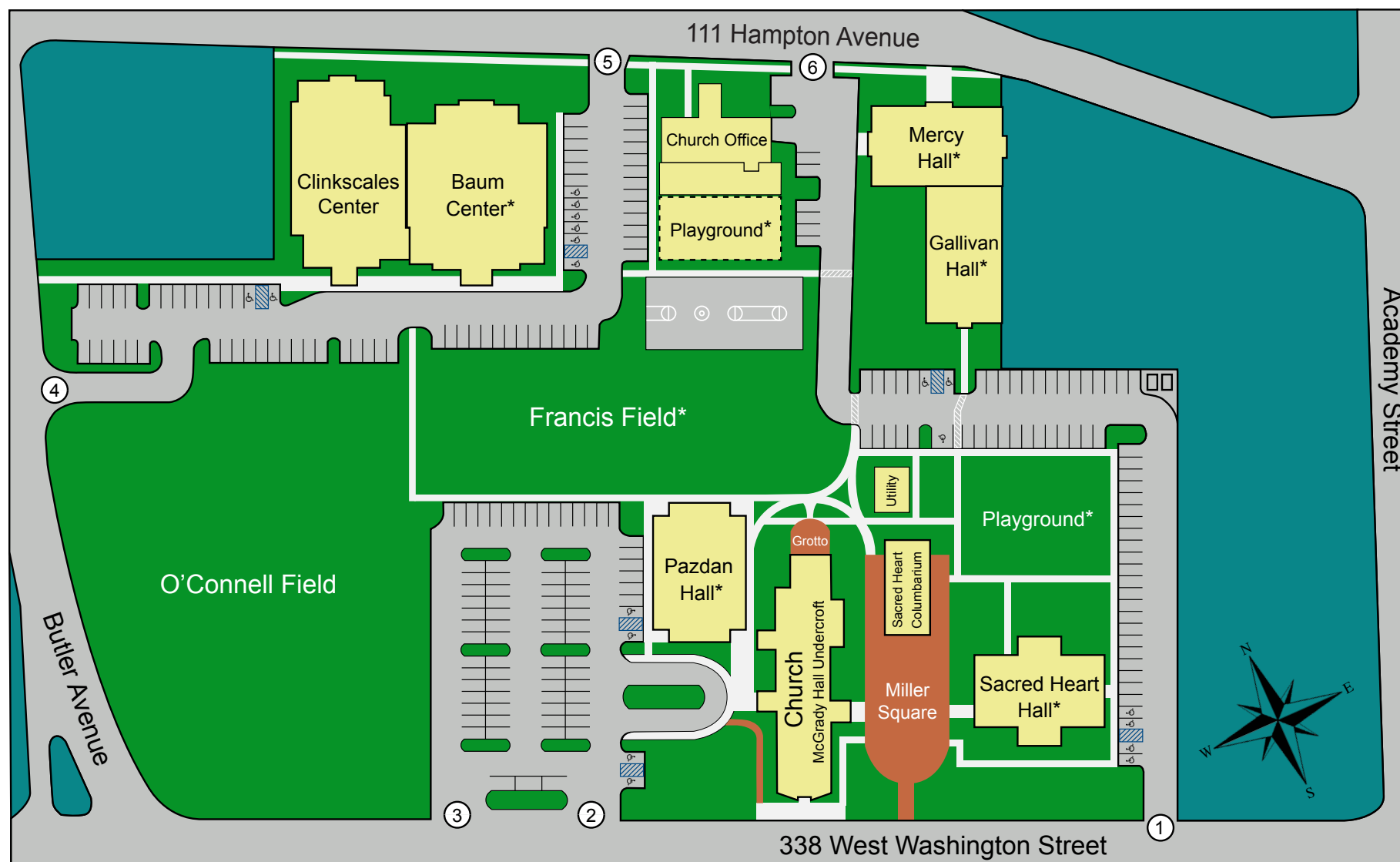
