Dear Friends in Christ,

Gender dysphoria is the experience some people have of an incongruity between the sex of their body and their feelings of gender identification, and such dysphoria is a true psychological burden for those who struggle with this interior conflict. But while we must always be compassionate in the face of the suffering of others, we must also continue to bear witness to the immutable truth that human nature is divided into two and only two sexes: male and female.

Both right reason and divine revelation affirm that the sex of persons is not assigned by choice; it is disclosed by biological fact. And neither is sexual identity the result of one's own subjective perception or the cultural constructs of others. The sex of each person is determined at the cellular level in the womb, and the sexual reality of the body cannot be changed by any technique of surgery or therapy.

Until the last few decades this view of human nature was universally accepted in every culture, but one dimension of the sexual revolution has been to question the very foundations of what male and female are and to assert that gender identity is radically different from biological sex. From that starting point, a cultural, medical, and legal revolution has unfolded throughout the Western world, and the absurd claim has been made that each of us is always free to choose our own gender and that everyone else must respect our choices no matter what biology says about these matters.

And so in the name of compassion for those who experience gender dysphoria, the revolution moved to the claim that all legal and cultural distinctions between male and female are arbitrary and that to avoid injustice every individual and institution in society must submit to the claim of each person to choose his own gender identity. For the past several years this madness has held the high ground in the political, legal, medical, academic, and entertainment fields, and from public rest rooms to athletic teams to military units to prisons, it seemed that this revolution was irresistible. But it only seemed that way.

Right reason is now reasserting itself in many ways, at least in the United States and the United Kingdom, and I suspect that the power of the gender hustle will soon collapse throughout the West. But the wreckage of the revolution is all around us, and many people have been deeply wounded in the chaos. If you want to learn more about these matters and help others find peace and healing, I suggest two resources.

Biological Integrity (https://biologicalintegrity.org) is a project of the American College of Pediatricians, and Person and Identity (https://personandidentity.com) is a project of the Ethics and Public Policy Center. Both of these websites contain useful information to help us find calm in the storm and bring right reason back to public life.





Frequently Asked Questions

What is the **Catholic Appeal of South Carolina**?

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you

come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as <u>Inactive</u> and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgvl.org.

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and

participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Monday 10 March at 6.30 pm.** Contact Deacon Joe Sanfilippo at 864.679.4119 or joe.sanfilippo@smcgvl.org to register.




