Dear Friends in Christ,

Numinous. This is not a word one hears in casual conversation, but it is an English word that entered our language in the 17th century from the Latin word *numen* which means divine presence. Numinous is an adjective that includes a field of meanings, including concepts like spiritual, holy, religious, transcendent, mysterious, divine, sacred, and other worldly. Numinous is a good word to describe any religious experience which lifts one out of oneself and makes one aware that the visible world points beyond itself to the source of all being. The idea of the numinous is not a uniquely Christian concept, and people of all religions and no religion have experiences that can be described as numinous.

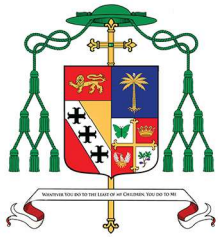
Nevertheless, Christians can profit from understanding that our worship and prayer should be characterized by a numinous quality, and this is one of the many reasons why our churches should not look like auditoriums or theaters. If the building has a numinous quality, then the liturgy which is celebrated inside that building stands a greater chance of having a numinous quality than prayer which takes place in a utilitarian structure. No one would mistake a Gothic cathedral or a Romanesque basilica for a lecture hall or a meeting room, but too many of our churches built in the last generation have just that secular quality and such spaces make a numinous experience of prayer much more difficult to attain.

But if truly sacred buildings are essential to a numinous experience of prayer, the same can be said for the style of music; the design of furnishings, vestments and vessels; the quality of ritual form; and the congregational participation which together constitute the warp and woof of public prayer. People who are present in the congregation but who refuse to worship can impede a numinous experience of prayer as much as an irreverent priest or inappropriate music, and therefore learning how to worship is an essential task for every Christian.

Learning how to worship? Doesn't that come naturally to anyone in church? No, not in the least, and just because someone is in church does not mean he is worshiping. We must be taught how to pray. And more than that, we must be shown how to worship in spirit and truth. No one can worship if anger, resentment, and pride make it impossible for him to kneel in supplication for mercy and restoration. And no one can worship who will not lift up his heart in sorrow for sin, adoration of God, and praise for the divine glory revealed in the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

But once we learn to worship, then the experience of praying can be, well, numinous. A heart full of love yields both the peace of sacred silence and joy of sacred song. A heart full of love responds to the invitation to pray and seeks the Face of God in the numinous experience of a holy people gathered in a holy place to do a holy thing simply for the sake of praising the One who is holy. Praised be Jesus Christ. Now and forever!

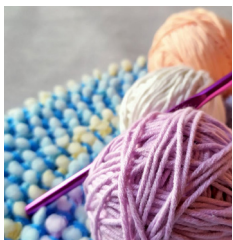
Wit & Wisdom Bible Study

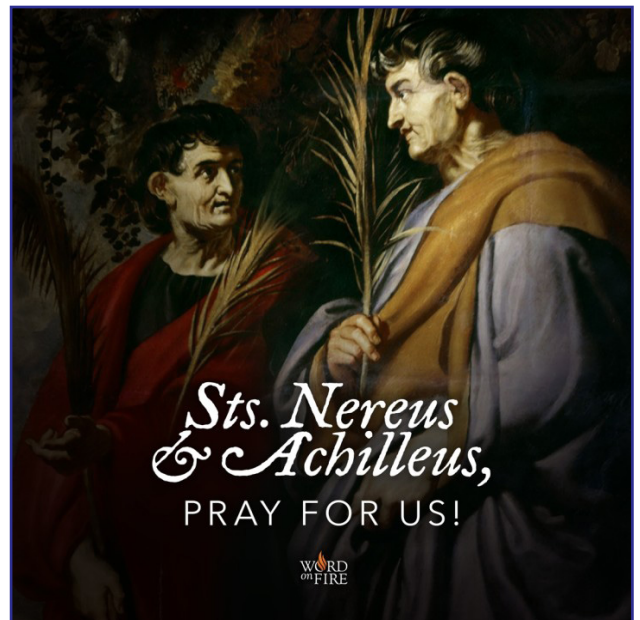

What Is A EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION?



A Eucharistic procession is a holy parade that brings Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist, into the world that he loves. The Blessed Sacrament is placed in a monstrance and carried out of the church by a priest. A Eucharistic procession sometimes begins at one church and ends at another and is connected to the celebration of the Mass or a time of Adoration. The procession can be a short walk around the neighborhood of a church or can stretch for miles and miles from start to finish. Along the way, Jesus is accompanied by priests, deacons, altar servers, and people of all ages. Together they can pray the rosary, sing hymns, or walk in silent prayer. Processions are often planned for the Solemnity of Corpus Christi but can take place any time of the year.

The altar servers or other members of the Eucharistic procession might carry a canopy, processional cross, candles, a thurible, or bells. One type of processional canopy, a baldacchino, is held over the monstrance by four servers holding a pole for each corner. This creates a sacred space that is set aside for the Eucharist during the movement of the procession. The processional cross is a large crucifix attached to a long handle that can be lifted high for all to see. The candles remind us of Jesus, the Light of the World, truly present in the Holy Eucharist. The thurible is filled with burning incense, which releases sweet-smelling smoke that rises to the sky, symbolizing our prayers rising to heaven. The bells incorporate another of our five senses, announcing that Jesus is here with us. A Eucharistic procession is a wonderful opportunity to worship our Lord and pray together as a community as we witness our faith publicly to the world. *Excerpt from* <https://www.eucharisticrevival.org>

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you

come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as Inactive and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgv1.org.

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Tuesday 16 June at 6.30 pm.** Contact Patrick Ford at patrick.ford@smcgv1.org to register.

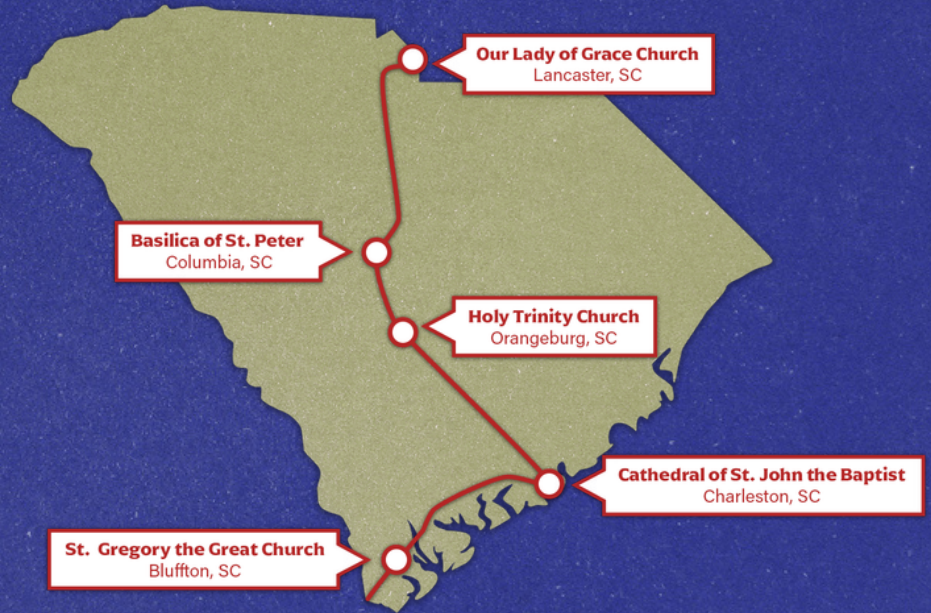

WHY

In honor of America's 250th year, the 2026 National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will carry the theme *One Nation Under God*. It is an invitation to realign our lives, communities and country under the sovereignty of Christ. It is a call to build unity through prayer, and to let Jesus, present in the **Most Holy Eucharist**, renew and heal the heart of our country, one soul at a time. This initiative of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops invites us all to join, in person or in spirit, to offer prayers and sacrifices for the renewal of America.

WHAT

The pilgrimage begins over Memorial Day weekend in St. Augustine, Florida, where the first Mass in our country was celebrated. The route will continue up the Eastern Seaboard through most of the 13 original colonies, reaching as far north as New Hampshire and Maine. Stops will be made in the Archdiocese of Baltimore, our country's very first Catholic diocese, as well as the Archdiocese of Boston to visit significant national historical sites. The pilgrimage concludes over the 4th of July weekend in Philadelphia, in honor of the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence.

WHEN

Five parishes along the route in South Carolina will host the 9 national pilgrims, their accompanying priest, and the Holy Eucharist. The National Pilgrimage group will be "handed off" from the Diocese of Savannah to the Diocese of Charleston on May 28, and our part of the journey begins! Visit charlestdioocese.org/eucharist2026.

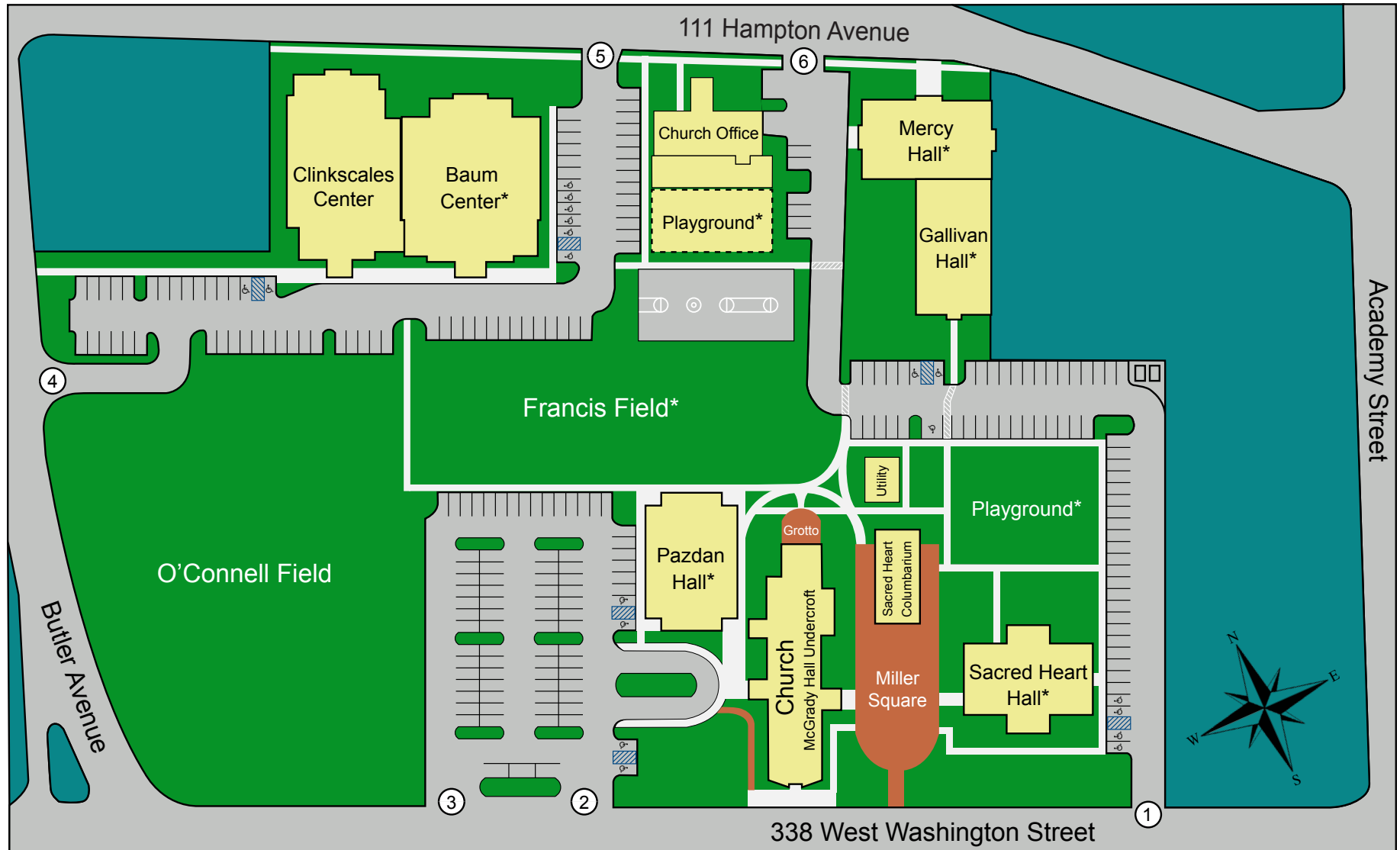
