Dear Friends in Christ,

The Declaration of Independence was promulgated 250 years ago this Saturday, and July the Fourth is conventionally reckoned to be the birthday of our nation, but is it? The Continental Congress may have declared our independence from Great Britain, but this did not become a military fact until October 1781 with the surrender of British forces at Yorktown. And even then, the Crown did not renounce all claims on the American Colonies until the Treaty of Paris in 1783, nearly two years after Yorktown. Even after the war, the former British Colonies did not of course immediately become one nation. In fact, there was a very real possibility of thirteen sovereign nations emerging from the Revolutionary War, and the Articles of Confederation of 1781 proved to be unsatisfactory, in part, for this very reason. The Constitutional Convention adopted the proposed Constitution of the United States of America on 17 September 1787 but it was not ratified until 21 June 1788, and the first ten amendments, which constitute the Bill of Rights, were not complete until 1791. And everything that seemed so clear when George Washington became our first president in 1788 was tested almost beyond endurance in the War Between the States which started 73 years after the Constitution was ratified. So, when is the birthday of our nation?

The complexity of our history reminds us, as the Founding Fathers knew, that this Republic is merely an experiment in liberty and that there is no guarantee that our children and their children shall live free in a place called the United States of America simply because we did. The power of this nation and the strength of our institutions can create the illusion of perpetual vigor and permanence, but a visit to Rome in the days of Caesar Augustus would have conveyed exactly the same illusion. Human history has never known of a permanent political order, and so we can never assume that the present shape of our nation is a simple fact of life that we can take for granted. We are engaged in an experiment, and experiments can fail. So how can we help insure the success of our ongoing experiment in liberty?

The capacity of "the People" to be sovereign, to govern themselves through freely elected representatives, depends directly on the capacity of each person to govern himself. In other words, we must each be virtuous if we are all to be free. The cultivation of personal virtue is hard work, and it requires discipline and the acceptance of a standard of virtue beyond one's own desires and choices. This is why the culture of radical autonomy which is now used to justify moral degradation of every conceivable sort is, in truth, a greater threat to the liberty of our nation than any external enemy or armed force. Making our own desires the measure of goodness is a sure path to individual vice and national servitude, and on the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, we can best serve the cause of our nation's freedom by resolving to cultivate virtue in our own lives.

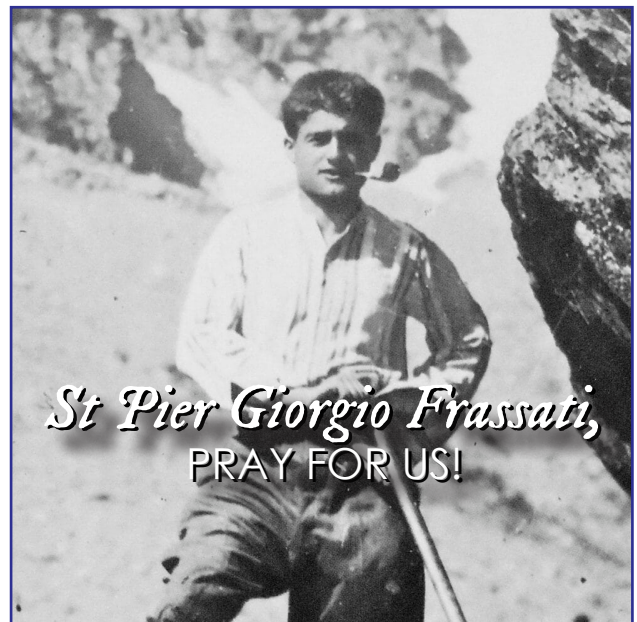

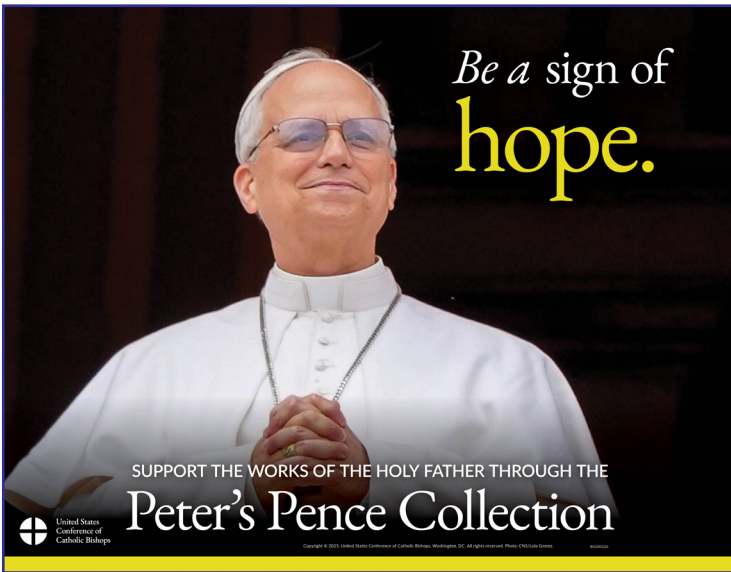

## Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

### Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

**Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as Inactive and envelopes are no longer distributed.** To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at [sarah.perkins@smcgv1.org](mailto:sarah.perkins@smcgv1.org).

### Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Monday 14 September at 6.30 pm.** Contact Patrick Ford at [patrick.ford@smcgv1.org](mailto:patrick.ford@smcgv1.org) to register.

# Keeping Children and Teens **SAFE ONLINE**

Computers and mobile devices can be helpful tools for children and teens to learn and grow in faith and fellowship. Unfortunately, the digital world is also full of unsafe and explicit content. You wouldn't hand a teen the car keys without first teaching them how to drive. The same should be true for using technology—teach them how to keep themselves and others safe while using it.

**You can use the following tips to better protect young people from harm online:**



**1 Model appropriate online behavior for young people.** Children look to their parents to teach and show them the ways to appropriately use technology. The biggest influence on what children see as acceptable or unacceptable is you.

**2 Teach your children not to share private information or images online.** Strangers posing as online friends can try to gain the trust of minors. Personal information such as name, address, and phone number should never be shared with an unknown person. Tell your children to immediately tell a trusted adult if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable.

**3 Limit usage of computers and mobile devices to public spaces in the home.** Not only will this help to prevent young people from accessing unsafe websites, it will also help them to develop safe browsing habits later in life.

**4 Install software that can block or monitor explicit website use.** Open access to harmful websites, like those that include pornography, is a constant threat to

young people. Website filters can prevent access to harmful and explicit sites and some can even alert you when such a site is accessed.

**5 Review and discuss the websites your child has visited and apps they have used.** Oversight of your child or teen's browsing history and app usage can help to keep them safe online. If you notice your child has browsed an unsafe website or app, discuss why that behavior is harmful. Learn about current apps that could be harmful to children and teenagers, especially those that involve image sharing, private communication, or the illusion of privacy.

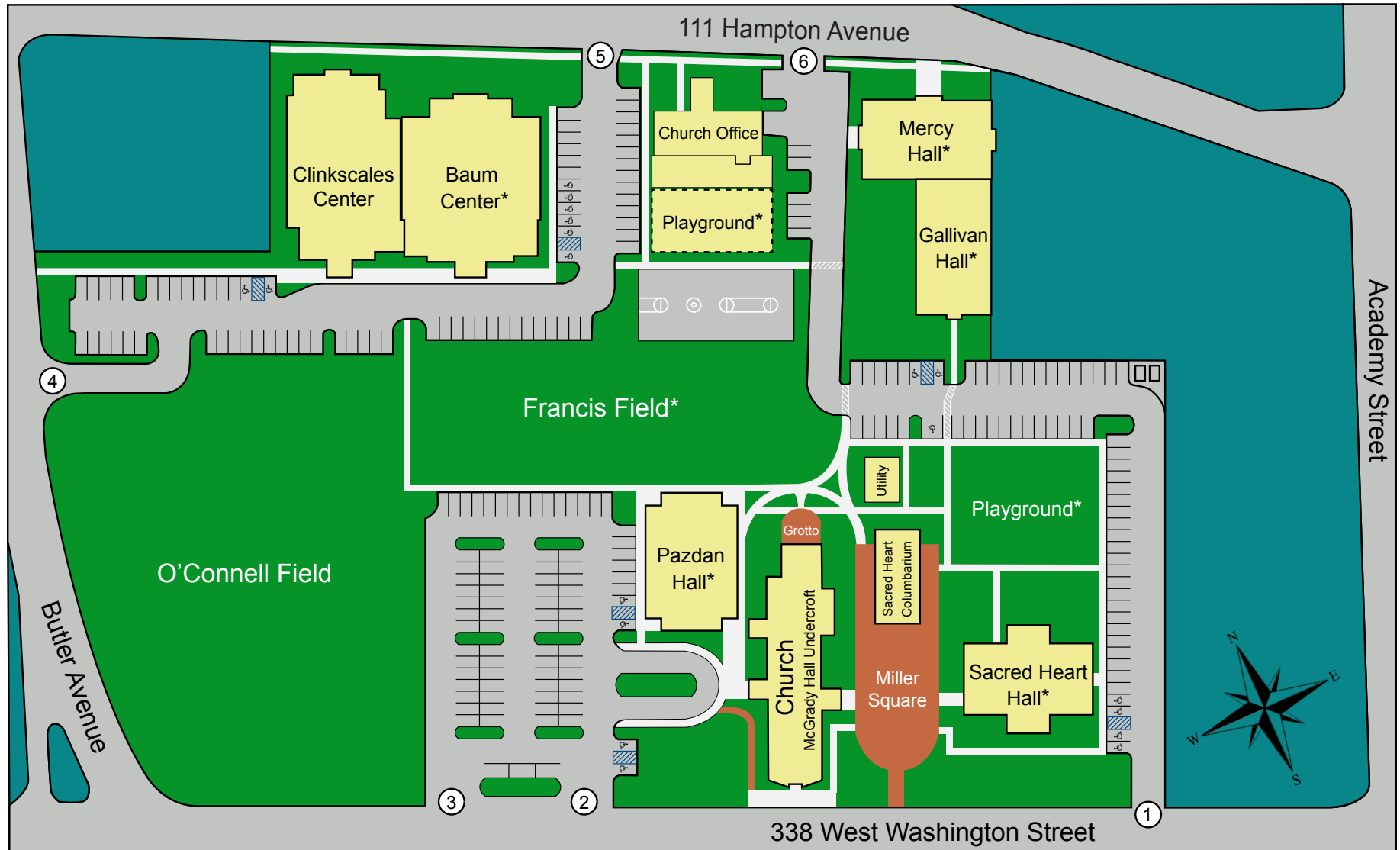
**6 Report online exploitation of minors to public authorities.** If you become aware of explicit content involving minors, such as solicitation, explicit images or videos, you should submit a report to law enforcement or through resources like CyberTipline from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.
