Dear Friends in Christ,

Righteous is a word we do not often hear these days except as a form of condemnation when we say that someone is self-righteous, but the concept of righteousness must be a central part of any attempt to describe and lead a life that is truly good rather than wicked and self-absorbed. The word righteous entered the English language in the early 16th century as a way to translate the Greek word *dikaiois*, which appears 74 times in the New Testament, 25 of those being found in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Righteous and *dikaiois* mean to act in accord with the eternal law of God, to be free from sin, and to be innocent of wrongdoing. And what the Word of God reveals to us is that righteousness is found only in Jesus Christ and that we become righteous only by grace through faith in Jesus Christ.

Do a word search online or consult a Bible concordance for the words righteous and righteousness to see the many verses of Holy Scripture which describe what righteousness is and how we find it. A life without righteousness is a life without clear meaning, direction, or hope for anything beyond the grave, and a quick glance at the nihilism and chaos in the world provides clear confirmation of what the absence of righteousness does both to individual lives and to entire societies.

We live in a time of unimaginable prosperity and technical mastery over the material world, but we also live in such spiritual and cultural darkness that we can no longer name the differences between boys and girls without breaking laws erected by the dictatorship of relativism. Our machines probe the mysteries of the cosmos, but our souls are so shriveled that death by despair (suicide and overdose) is now so common that our average lifespan has contracted for the first time in a century. Our leaders in every sphere of human activity, including religion, are largely aimless, graceless, and feckless, and their schemes for restoring good order in human affairs are usually pointless. We live in the midst of lawlessness and hopelessness because we live in a time of unrighteousness. So what should we do? What can we do? We can hear and heed the Word of God. We can make a decision for Christ. We can take up our cross and follow the Savior.

The Lord Jesus began his ministry with a clarion call to conversion: "The time is fulfilled, and the Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the Gospel." (Mark 1:15) Societies, cultures, and entire civilizations are shaped one life at a time, and that is how disciples of the Lord Jesus are also formed - one at a time. We seek God's kingdom and his righteousness by acknowledging our sins and rejecting whatever is contrary to the Gospel, for "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:8-9)

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as **Inactive** and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgvl.org.

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Monday 14 September at 6.30 pm.** Contact Patrick Ford at patrick.ford@smcgvl.org to register.

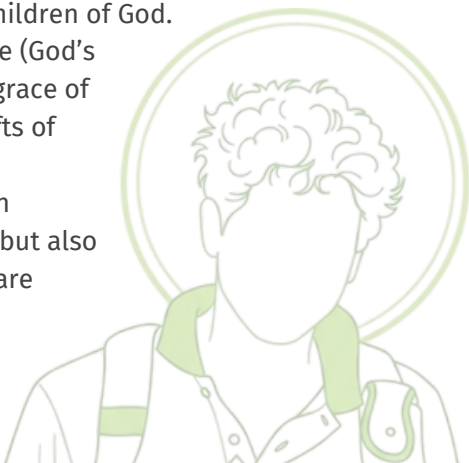

THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

*Read the Catechism of the Catholic Church
774-776, 780-801, 1113-1131, 1691-1698*

- The Church is referred to as the People of God, the Body of Christ, the Temple of the Holy Spirit, and the Bride of Christ, among other titles.
- The Church is also referred to as the “universal sacrament of salvation” because she is the sign and instrument of the reconciliation and communion God desires for all of humanity.
- Sacraments are visible and efficacious (effective) signs of grace instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, through which God gives divine life.
- This salvific (saving) work of the Church is especially visible in the Seven Sacraments.
- The Seven Sacraments are: Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist, Penance, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony.
- Beginning in baptism and through all the sacraments, new life is communicated to the faithful.
- This is a life as children of God.
- It is the divine life (God's life) lived in the grace of Christ and the gifts of the Holy Spirit.
- Life in Christ is an elevated calling, but also one to which all are called.



Feasts & Solemnities

JULY 3: ST. THOMAS, APOSTLE

He is often called “Doubting Thomas” because he did not initially believe that the other apostles had seen the risen Christ. However, his words upon encountering Christ constitute the most prominent declaration of Jesus's divine identity in the New Testament: “My Lord and my God!” (Jn 20:28). According to tradition, St. Thomas traveled as far as India on his missionary journeys, where he suffered martyrdom.

JULY 6: ST. MARIA GORRETTI, VIRGIN AND MARTYR

While still a young girl, St. Maria Gorretti was tragically and violently killed. Her resistance to her attacker was driven by her concern for the status of his soul (that he would be committing a mortal sin). She later forgave him before just her death. Her attacker, Alessandro Serenelli, served 27 years in prison, during which he experienced a deep conversion facilitated by the appearance of Maria Gorretti to him in a dream. He even attended her canonization in Rome in 1950 and later lived a life of prayer and penance as a lay Capuchin Franciscan.

JULY 14: ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA, VIRGIN

St. Kateri Tekakwitha was the first Native American saint to be canonized. When she was very young, Kateri's immediate family died of smallpox. Although left with scarring, Kateri survived and was raised by her uncle, who was a chief of the Mohawks. After refusing the promptings of her aunt and uncle to marry, Kateri converted to Catholicism and eventually took a vow of chastity, taking only Jesus Christ as her spouse. Her aunt and uncle and others in the Mohawk community disapproved of this vow, even accusing her of sorcery. She was forced to leave her home and live with a Christian community near Montreal.

JULY 22: ST. MARY MAGDALENE

St. Mary Magdalene is famous called the “Apostle to the Apostles.” As the first witness of Christ's resurrection, she is the one who first told the Apostles the Good News (see Jn 20:11-18).

JULY 25: ST. JAMES, APOSTLE

St. James “the Greater” is called thus because he is the older of the two apostles named James and because his calling by Jesus came earlier. He is the brother of John and a son of Zebedee. He, along with his brother John and Peter, is one of the three apostles present at key events in Jesus' ministry, such as the Transfiguration. According to tradition, he traveled to Spain to preach the Gospel, then traveled back to the Holy Land where he was killed by Herod. His followers subsequently brought his remains back to Spain. That site, Santiago de Compostela, was rediscovered in the ninth century and remains a popular place of pilgrimage to this day.

JULY 29: STS. MARTHA, MARY AND LAZARUS

Jesus famously raises Lazarus from the dead in John's Gospel, but he does so only after he weeps (Jn 11:35). The three siblings from Bethany show us that Jesus had close friends who were dear to him. In raising Lazarus from the dead, Jesus not only showed his divine power, but also gave a preview of his own resurrection.

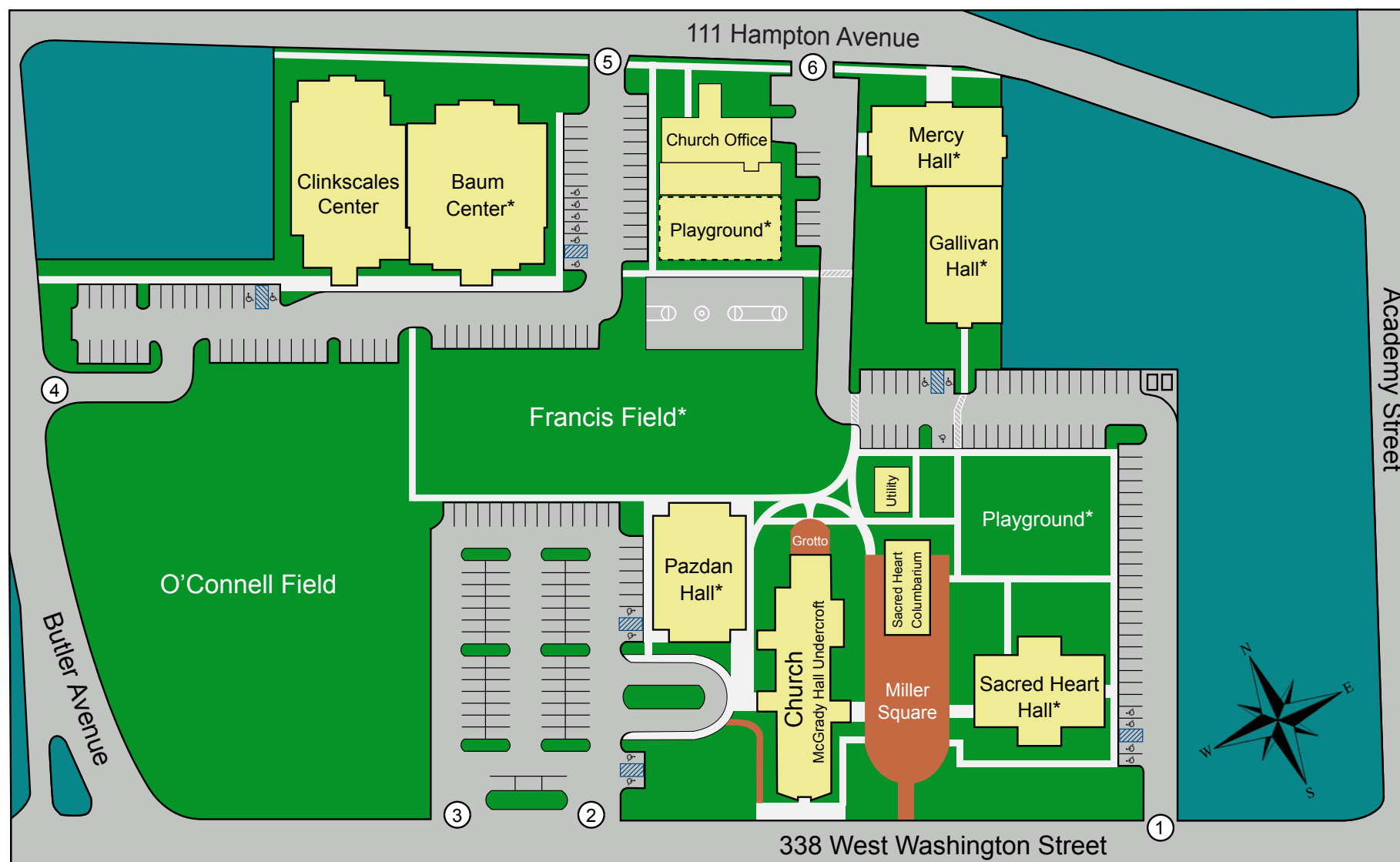
