Dear Friends in Christ,

The Feast of the Transfiguration, which will be celebrated this Thursday, is described with slightly different emphases by Matthew, Mark and Luke and recalls the manifestation of the divine glory of the Lord Jesus to Peter, James and John on Mount Tabor. During this revelation of His divine nature to human eyes, Jesus was accompanied by Moses and Elijah, living symbols of the Law and Prophets, who spoke to their Savior about the suffering which He would endure in His passion and death. This combination of suffering and glory reveals the paradox at the heart of the Gospel which was spoken of by the Lord Jesus just before His Transfiguration: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it." (Luke 9.23-24)

The oldest known liturgical celebration of this feast was in the Armenian Church, and the 7th century Armenian Bishop Gregory Arsharuni wrote that the feast was placed in the liturgy in the early 4th century by Saint Gregory the Illuminator. In the Orthodox Church, the Feast of the Transfiguration is one of the Twelve Great Feasts of the liturgical year, and it is both preceded by a fast and celebrated with a Vigil and an Octave, in the way Latin Rite Catholics celebrate Christmas and Easter. These liturgical observances underscore the importance of the truths revealed to us by the Transfiguration of the Lord.

The Feast of the Transfiguration, which from antiquity has been kept on 6 August, forty days before the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, gradually entered the liturgical life of the Western Church through our monasteries, and by the tenth century this feast was observed in many of the dioceses of England, France and Germany. But despite the importance and widespread celebration of this feast, it was not placed by the Pope on the Universal Calendar until the 15th century, and the reason for that change is a timely one for us.

In 1453, Sultan Mohammed II conquered the great Christian imperial capital of Constantinople thus ending the Roman Empire in the East and laying the foundation of the Ottoman Empire. From that time forward the armies of Islam seemed to be invincible, and the Turks were on the move north and west. But on 22 July 1456, János Hunyady, the Governor of Hungary and a devout Catholic, led a Christian army to victory over the Turks at Belgrade, marking a turning point in the centuries-long struggle between the Christian West and militant Islam. In celebration of this victory, Pope Callistus III extended the Feast of the Transfiguration to the universal Church and ordered that it be kept each year on 6 August. Callistus died two years later on 6 August 1458.

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as **Inactive** and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgvl.org.

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Monday 14 September at 6.30 pm.** Contact Patrick Ford at patrick.ford@smcgvl.org to register.

CHRISTIAN LIVING

Read the Catechism of the Catholic Church
1716-1717; 1725-1726; 1954-1962; 1980; 2055-2057

- The natural law is written on everyone's heart and is a form of human participation in God's wisdom and goodness; it gives humanity an original moral sense to discern good and bad
- Yet, because of sin, the perception of the natural law is clouded
- Because of this God has given his "revealed" law
- The summary of the moral truths of the old law, the first stage of revealed law, can be found in the *Decalogue*, or Ten Commandments, which point to both love of God and love of neighbor
- The word "beatitude" points to the eternal happiness toward which all humanity is called
- In the Gospel, Jesus shows his followers the way to participation in divine life
- This way, in imitation of Christ himself, is the love of truth and goodness
- The Beatitudes, which are central to Jesus' preaching, are in continuity with and in fulfillment of God's promises throughout salvation history
- Jesus' interpretation of the law (Torah) is centered on love
- Jesus places the love of God as the greatest commandment (see Dt 6:4)
- He then places love of neighbor alongside it (see Lev 19:18)
- These form a single, twofold command of love that encapsulate the law and prophets



Feasts & Solemnities

AUGUST 6: TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

The feast of the Transfiguration commemorates the dedication of basilicas on Mount Tabor, where Jesus was "transfigured" — or changed in appearance — before Peter, James and John. He was seen conversing with Moses and Elijah (see Mt 17:1-9; Mk 9:2-10; Lk 9:28-36). The event gives us a glimpse into Jesus' identity and mission. The liturgical feast was established in the fifth century and was set exactly 40 days before the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross (Sept. 14), highlighting the link between the Transfiguration and the cross.

AUGUST 14: ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE, PRIEST AND MARTYR

St. Maximilian Kolbe was martyred during World War II at the Nazi concentration camp Auschwitz. The Franciscan priest offered himself in the place of fellow prisoner Franciszek Gajowniczek. Well before his martyrdom, Father Kolbe founded the Militia Immaculatae, a group dedicated to spreading the Gospel through Marian devotion. This date commemorates the day he was executed, a day before the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

AUGUST 15: ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

While the belief that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven has been held by Christians for centuries, it was formally declared an infallible dogma of the Catholic Church by Pope Pius XII on Nov. 1, 1950.

AUGUST 22: QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

When Pius XII introduced this memorial to the liturgical calendar in 1954, it was celebrated on May 31 to end the month typically devoted to Mary. Paul VI moved it to Aug. 22 to highlight the "octave," or eighth day after the feast of the Assumption.

AUGUST 24: ST. BARTHOLOMEW, APOSTLE

St. Bartholomew is only mentioned in the Synoptic Gospels within the list of the 12 Apostles. He is typically identified with "Nathanael" in John's Gospel. Traditionally, he is believed to have been martyred in Armenia.

AUGUST 27: ST. MONICA

St. Monica famously prayed for the conversion of her son, Augustine. Eventually these prayers were answered and her son became one of the most influential writers in Christian history. Many parents today turn to Monica's intercession as they pray for their children to return.

AUGUST 28: ST. AUGUSTINE, BISHOP AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

St. Augustine was one of the most prolific writers of his and of all time. His works are philosophical and theological classics. His ability to connect faith and reason makes him one of the most important theologians in the history of the Church.

AUGUST 28: PASSION OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

John the Baptist's martyrdom by beheading is recounted in Scripture (see Mk 6:17-29). By his brutal death — as ordered by Herod Antipas — John, whose mission was to announce the coming of the Messiah, also points to the Messiah's death. An ancient tradition holds that this day commemorates the day John's head was found.

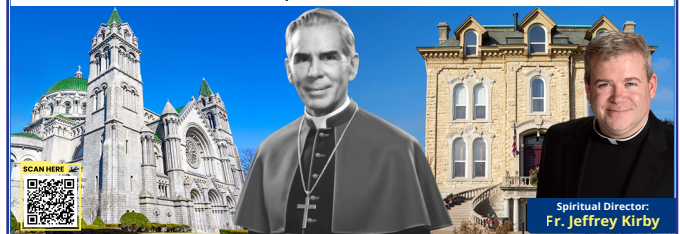

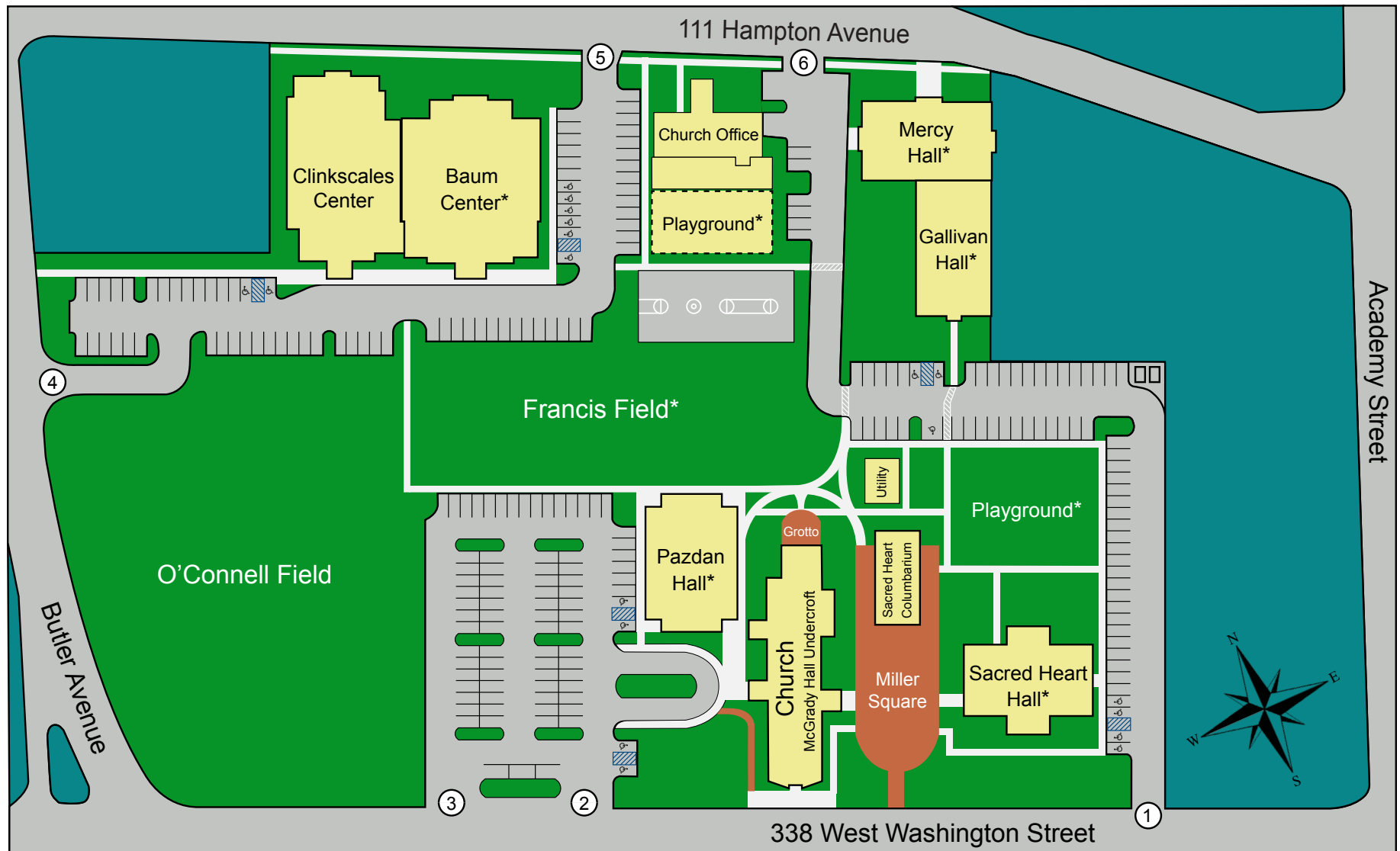
