Dear Friends in Christ,

The First Principle of Evangelical Catholicism is: “The Lord Jesus Christ is the crucified and risen Savior of all mankind, and no human person can fully understand his life or find his dignity and destiny apart from a personal friendship with the Lord Jesus. It is not enough to know who Jesus is; we must know Jesus.”

The first claim made here is absolute and uncompromising: Jesus of Nazareth is the only savior of the entire human race and his identity as the Messiah is finally and fully revealed in his suffering, death, and Resurrection. In an age that prizes individual choice above all else, this claim is often rejected as offensive, but in every age Christ is a stumbling block: “For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God.” (1 Cor 1.22-24) The Lord Jesus is either the Son of God, or he is not. He was either conceived without a human father, or he was not. He is either the Second Person of the Most Holy Trinity, or he is not. And on the answers to these questions turns the entire Christian religion, because Jesus of Nazareth (in C.S. Lewis’s famous formulation) is one of only three things: a liar, a lunatic, or the Lord.

Next, if Jesus is Lord (meaning the eternal Word by whom and for whom all things were made) then the next part of the first principle follows: our lives are unintelligible until we know the Lord Jesus and live as his students and his friends. To Catholics of a certain age, this claim will sound strange because at times in our recent history there was insufficient emphasis in catechesis on the necessity of a personal friendship with the Lord Jesus, and for this reason the very language sounds Protestant and decidedly un-Catholic. But the best of Catholic tradition, taught by the Church and lived by the saints, always puts a true human relationship with the Lord Jesus in first place, as Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger explained in his homily to the College of Cardinals on the day before he was elected Benedict XVI: “Our redemption is brought about in this communion of wills: being friends of Jesus, to become friends of God. The more we love Jesus, the more we know him, the more our true freedom develops and our joy in being redeemed flourishes. Thank you, Jesus, for your friendship!”

That is why it is not enough to know who Jesus is; rather, we must know Jesus. And we come to know Jesus in the Holy Scriptures, in the Sacraments of the Church, in prayer both alone and with other Christians, in service to the least of his brethren, and - above all - in the “breaking of the bread,” the Most Holy Eucharist. Becoming Evangelical Catholics means that we must seek to know Christ in all of these ways on a regular basis and open our hearts and minds to him as he reveals himself for our salvation and the salvation of the world.

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as **Inactive** and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgvl.org.

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Monday 14 September at 6.30 pm.** Contact Patrick Ford at patrick.ford@smcgvl.org to register.

CHRISTIAN LIVING

Read the Catechism of the Catholic Church
1716-1717; 1725-1726; 1954-1962; 1980; 2055-2057

- The natural law is written on everyone's heart and is a form of human participation in God's wisdom and goodness; it gives humanity an original moral sense to discern good and bad
- Yet, because of sin, the perception of the natural law is clouded
- Because of this God has given his "revealed" law
- The summary of the moral truths of the old law, the first stage of revealed law, can be found in the *Decalogue*, or Ten Commandments, which point to both love of God and love of neighbor
- The word "beatitude" points to the eternal happiness toward which all humanity is called
- In the Gospel, Jesus shows his followers the way to participation in divine life
- This way, in imitation of Christ himself, is the love of truth and goodness
- The Beatitudes, which are central to Jesus' preaching, are in continuity with and in fulfillment of God's promises throughout salvation history
- Jesus' interpretation of the law (Torah) is centered on love
- Jesus places the love of God as the greatest commandment (see Dt 6:4)
- He then places love of neighbor alongside it (see Lev 19:18)
- These form a single, twofold command of love that encapsulate the law and prophets



Feasts & Solemnities

AUGUST 6: TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

The feast of the Transfiguration commemorates the dedication of basilicas on Mount Tabor, where Jesus was "transfigured" — or changed in appearance — before Peter, James and John. He was seen conversing with Moses and Elijah (see Mt 17:1-9; Mk 9:2-10; Lk 9:28-36). The event gives us a glimpse into Jesus' identity and mission. The liturgical feast was established in the fifth century and was set exactly 40 days before the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross (Sept. 14), highlighting the link between the Transfiguration and the cross.

AUGUST 14: ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE, PRIEST AND MARTYR

St. Maximilian Kolbe was martyred during World War II at the Nazi concentration camp Auschwitz. The Franciscan priest offered himself in the place of fellow prisoner Franciszek Gajowniczek. Well before his martyrdom, Father Kolbe founded the Militia Immaculatae, a group dedicated to spreading the Gospel through Marian devotion. This date commemorates the day he was executed, a day before the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

AUGUST 15: ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

While the belief that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven has been held by Christians for centuries, it was formally declared an infallible dogma of the Catholic Church by Pope Pius XII on Nov. 1, 1950.

AUGUST 22: QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

When Pius XII introduced this memorial to the liturgical calendar in 1954, it was celebrated on May 31 to end the month typically devoted to Mary. Paul VI moved it to Aug. 22 to highlight the "octave," or eighth day after the feast of the Assumption.

AUGUST 24: ST. BARTHOLOMEW, APOSTLE

St. Bartholomew is only mentioned in the Synoptic Gospels within the list of the 12 Apostles. He is typically identified with "Nathanael" in John's Gospel. Traditionally, he is believed to have been martyred in Armenia.

AUGUST 27: ST. MONICA

St. Monica famously prayed for the conversion of her son, Augustine. Eventually these prayers were answered and her son became one of the most influential writers in Christian history. Many parents today turn to Monica's intercession as they pray for their children to return.

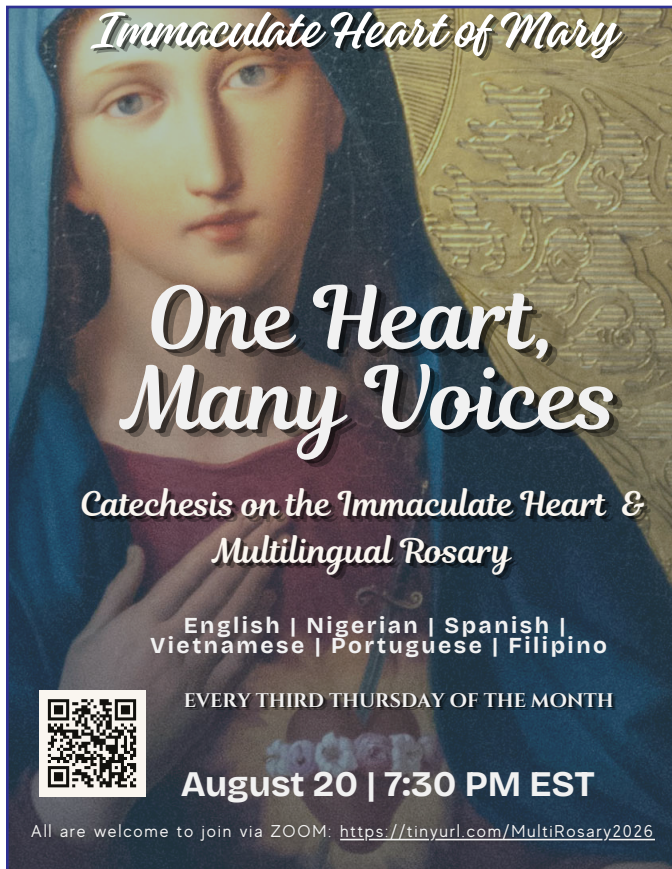
AUGUST 28: ST. AUGUSTINE, BISHOP AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

St. Augustine was one of the most prolific writers of his and of all time. His works are philosophical and theological classics. His ability to connect faith and reason makes him one of the most important theologians in the history of the Church.

AUGUST 28: PASSION OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

John the Baptist's martyrdom by beheading is recounted in Scripture (see Mk 6:17-29). By his brutal death — as ordered by Herod Antipas — John, whose mission was to announce the coming of the Messiah, also points to the Messiah's death. An ancient tradition holds that this day commemorates the day John's head was found.

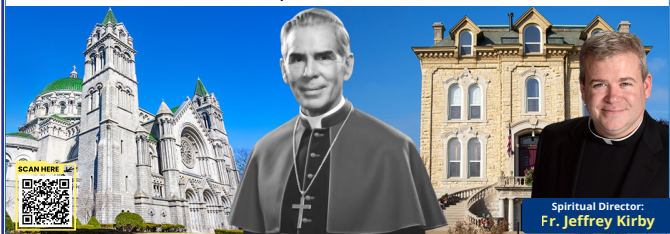

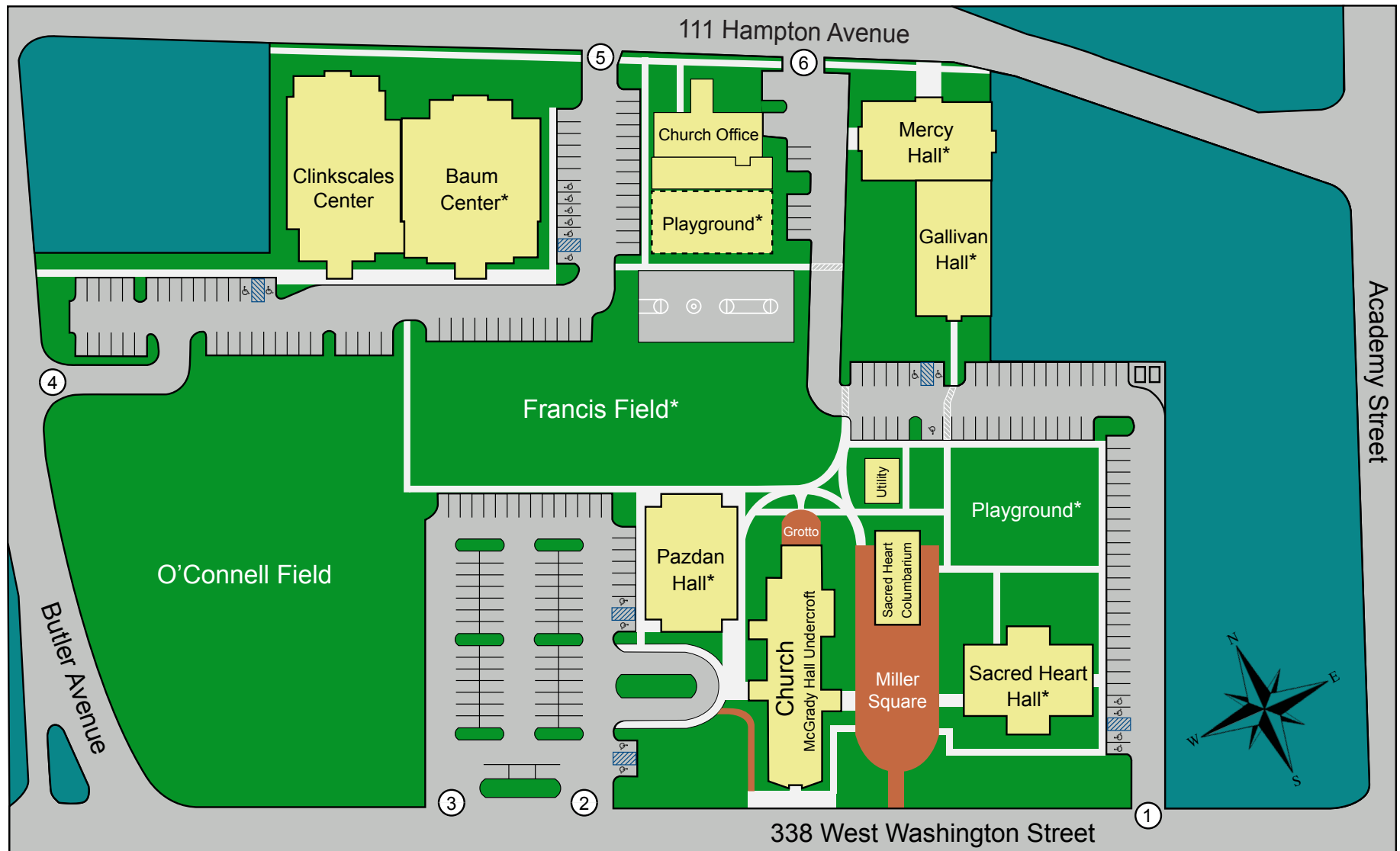

So if you are visiting the church during a school day, please park in the Washington Street lot at entrances 2 or 3. And if you are visiting the church office, please park beside the Baum Center at entrance 5 and walk on Hampton Avenue to our front door.
