Dear Friends in Christ,

The Second Principle of Evangelical Catholicism is: “The Gospel of Jesus Christ is divine revelation, not human wisdom, and the Gospel is given to us in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition which together constitute a single divine deposit of faith transmitted authentically and authoritatively by the Bishops in full communion with the Bishop of Rome. We must surrender our private judgments in all matters of faith and morals to the sacred teaching authority of the Church’s Magisterium if we are to receive the whole Gospel.”

Suspicion of authority is one of the hallmarks of our time, and the rejection of all authority except for one’s own thoughts and feelings is usually considered an essential condition of intellectual maturity and personal autonomy. Moreover, when this skepticism is married to the cynicism that now suffuses our entire culture, then people despair of the very possibility of a truth we can know with certainty and by which we can shape our lives without irony. But into this chaos the Lord Jesus speaks a divine word of saving truth: “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.” (Matthew 28.18-20)

In the First Principle of Evangelical Catholicism, we saw that saying “Jesus Christ is Lord” changes our lives in every way, and this Second Principle shows one of the most fundamental ways in which Christians are different from all others. We do not live in radical doubt of the fundamental truths about the origin and purpose of human life because the God who made us from nothing has shown Himself to us and explained His plan for our lives. He began this revelation through Israel and her inspired writings, and He completed this revelation in the life, death, and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ.

The Gospel of Jesus Christ a sure and certain guide that frees us from the skepticism and cynicism that lead so many people into the despair of nihilism. And we receive this Gospel with complete certainty of its truth only in the Catholic Church, in which the Bishops who stand in apostolic succession bear in its fullness the authority of the Savior to teach: “He who hears you hears me, and he who rejects you rejects me, and he who rejects me rejects him who sent me.” (Luke 10.16) Jesus gave His messianic authority to the Apostles, who were thus made authentic and authoritative teachers of the Gospel, and the Bishops who succeed the Apostles in every age do not teach from their own authority, learning, or wisdom. Rather, they teach only in the name of Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit, and this is why we can surrender our private judgments about all matters of faith and morals to the teaching of the Church without any loss of our legitimate autonomy and intellectual maturity: the Gospel transmitted in and by the Church is the power of God unto salvation for all who believe.

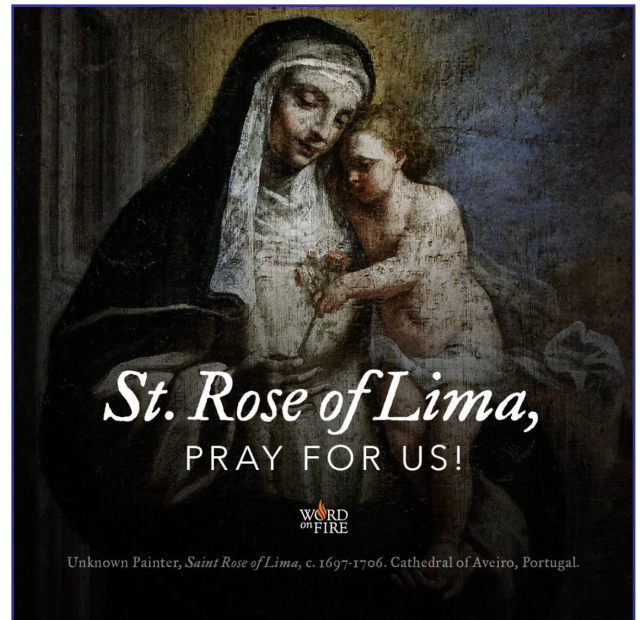

Offertory Envelopes and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Marriage



If you no longer receive weekly stewardship envelopes in the mail, you may have been marked as **Inactive** within our parishioner database. No matter how often you come to Mass at St Mary's, you are not considered an **Active** member of the parish unless you are registered here, attending Mass here each Sunday, and using the stewardship envelopes to fulfill two separate purposes: a) making your offertory contributions and other gifts, and b) establishing an attendance record.

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- ◆ Parishioner tuition in the school
- ◆ Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- ◆ Baptism, Confirmation, or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either here at St Mary's or in another parish)

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box for EFT on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection plate. All envelopes in the collection are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as **Inactive** and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes again, please email Sarah Perkins at sarah.perkins@smcgvl.org.

Baptism Class



Prior to having a child baptized at Saint Mary's, you must have been registered in the parish for at least six months, attending Sunday Mass each week, using the stewardship envelopes, and participating in the life of the parish. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 6.15 pm after the 5.00 pm Mass. Attending a Baptism Preparation Class is required and may be attended prior to the birth of your child. **The next class is Monday 14 September at 6.30 pm.** Contact Patrick Ford at patrick.ford@smcgvl.org to register.

CHRISTIAN LIVING

Read the Catechism of the Catholic Church
1716-1717; 1725-1726; 1954-1962; 1980; 2055-2057

- The natural law is written on everyone's heart and is a form of human participation in God's wisdom and goodness; it gives humanity an original moral sense to discern good and bad
- Yet, because of sin, the perception of the natural law is clouded
- Because of this God has given his "revealed" law
- The summary of the moral truths of the old law, the first stage of revealed law, can be found in the *Decalogue*, or Ten Commandments, which point to both love of God and love of neighbor
- The word "beatitude" points to the eternal happiness toward which all humanity is called
- In the Gospel, Jesus shows his followers the way to participation in divine life
- This way, in imitation of Christ himself, is the love of truth and goodness
- The Beatitudes, which are central to Jesus' preaching, are in continuity with and in fulfillment of God's promises throughout salvation history
- Jesus' interpretation of the law (Torah) is centered on love
- Jesus places the love of God as the greatest commandment (see Dt 6:4)
- He then places love of neighbor alongside it (see Lev 19:18)
- These form a single, twofold command of love that encapsulate the law and prophets



Feasts & Solemnities

AUGUST 6: TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

The feast of the Transfiguration commemorates the dedication of basilicas on Mount Tabor, where Jesus was "transfigured" — or changed in appearance — before Peter, James and John. He was seen conversing with Moses and Elijah (see Mt 17:1-9; Mk 9:2-10; Lk 9:28-36). The event gives us a glimpse into Jesus' identity and mission. The liturgical feast was established in the fifth century and was set exactly 40 days before the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross (Sept. 14), highlighting the link between the Transfiguration and the cross.

AUGUST 14: ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE, PRIEST AND MARTYR

St. Maximilian Kolbe was martyred during World War II at the Nazi concentration camp Auschwitz. The Franciscan priest offered himself in the place of fellow prisoner Franciszek Gajowniczek. Well before his martyrdom, Father Kolbe founded the Militia Immaculatae, a group dedicated to spreading the Gospel through Marian devotion. This date commemorates the day he was executed, a day before the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

AUGUST 15: ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

While the belief that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven has been held by Christians for centuries, it was formally declared an infallible dogma of the Catholic Church by Pope Pius XII on Nov. 1, 1950.

AUGUST 22: QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

When Pius XII introduced this memorial to the liturgical calendar in 1954, it was celebrated on May 31 to end the month typically devoted to Mary. Paul VI moved it to Aug. 22 to highlight the "octave," or eighth day after the feast of the Assumption.

AUGUST 24: ST. BARTHOLOMEW, APOSTLE

St. Bartholomew is only mentioned in the Synoptic Gospels within the list of the 12 Apostles. He is typically identified with "Nathanael" in John's Gospel. Traditionally, he is believed to have been martyred in Armenia.

AUGUST 27: ST. MONICA

St. Monica famously prayed for the conversion of her son, Augustine. Eventually these prayers were answered and her son became one of the most influential writers in Christian history. Many parents today turn to Monica's intercession as they pray for their children to return.

AUGUST 28: ST. AUGUSTINE, BISHOP AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

St. Augustine was one of the most prolific writers of his and of all time. His works are philosophical and theological classics. His ability to connect faith and reason makes him one of the most important theologians in the history of the Church.

AUGUST 28: PASSION OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

John the Baptist's martyrdom by beheading is recounted in Scripture (see Mk 6:17-29). By his brutal death — as ordered by Herod Antipas — John, whose mission was to announce the coming of the Messiah, also points to the Messiah's death. An ancient tradition holds that this day commemorates the day John's head was found.

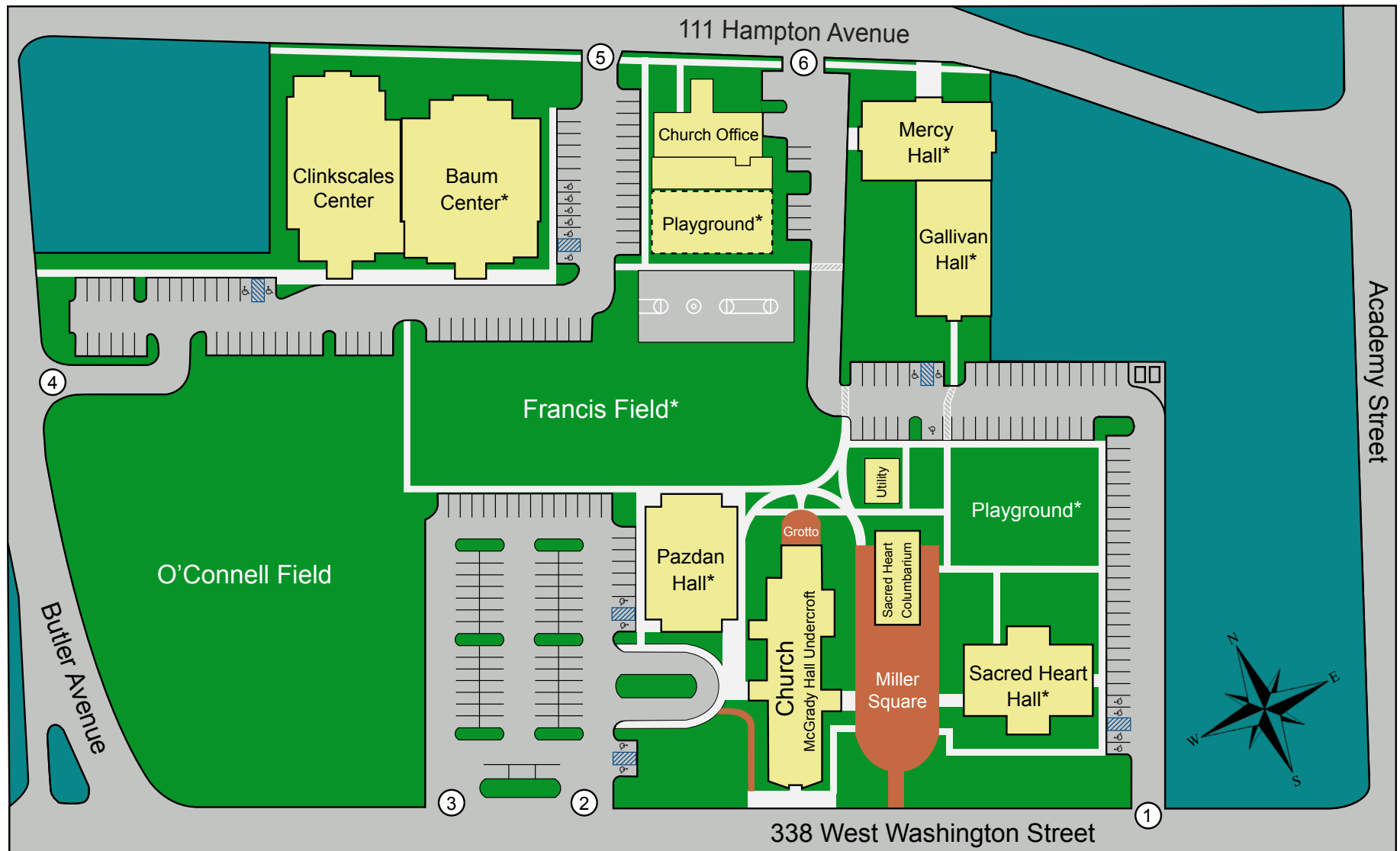

SAINT MARY'S CAMPUS MAP

Saint Mary's Church has nine buildings on nine acres of land, so this map is offered to help you find your way on our campus.

Please note that during the school day, it is not permitted for anyone to walk through the interior section of our campus in order to safeguard the children in our care. So if you are visiting the church during a school day, please park in the Washington Street lot at entrances 2 or 3. And if you are visiting the church office, please park beside the Baum Center at entrance 5 and walk on Hampton Avenue to our front door.
